Chief Minister Lays Foundation Stone for New Boys Hostel

On 19th February, 2007, Chief Minister, Shri Pratapsing Rane laid the Foundation Stone for a New Boys' Hostel for Goa University in the presence of the Vice-Chancellor of Goa University at the University Complex.

Speaking on this occasion, Shri. Rane assured of his governments total support to the University's activities to make it a centre of Excellence. Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. S. Zacharias gave the welcome address. Shri Manish Bahuguna, Managing Director, GSIDC also spoke on the occasion. Registrar, Dr. M. M. Sangodkar proposed the vote of Thanks.

The proposed area of the hostel is 3675 sq.mt. with a capacity of 84 twin staying rooms in a ground plus two-storied building. The project will be taken up by GSIDC.

The estimated cost on completion will be approximately Rs. 5 crores and the expected time of completion is 14 months from 25th January, 2007.

Seminar on 'Agricultural Development In Goa: Issues And Perspectives'

The Department of Economics, Goa University organised a Seminar on "Agricultural Development in Goa: Issues and Perspectives" on 24th February, 2007. The Chief Guest for the inaugural function was Dr. A.R. Padoshi, former Head of the Department of Economics, Goa University and former member of Goa Planning Board. Dr. Padoshi reviewed the process of economic growth of India. He pointed out that the rapid rate of growth in India which is led by the service sector is NOT sustainable because the service sector cannot produce concrete wealth but merely transfers the wealth. He expressed regret that agriculture and inflation which were almost forgotten in India have come to the centre stage due to dangers posed to Indian Economy due to poor growth of agriculture. He also warned that unless the agricultural sector is revolutionized by massive investment, it will be impossible to sustain 9% growth in the eleventh Five Year Plan.

Earlier Dr. Silvia Noronha, Head, Dept. of Economics, Goa University welcomed the seminar. In her welcome address she lamented that agriculture in Goa was almost non-existent. Today, Goa is heavily dependent on the neighbouring states for its supply of agricultural goods which places Goa in a precarious position. She also commented that the Agricultural Tenancy Act 1964, was probably one of the many factors that sounded the death knell to Goan Agriculture. The seminar was attended by faculty members of university and affiliated colleges from the field of economics and students.

Regional Seminar on Marine Microbial Interactions

A two day seminar was organised by the department of Microbiology, Goa University on 1st and 2nd March 2007. The theme of the seminar is 'Marine Microbial Interactions'. Dr. D. Chandramohan, Consultant, NIOT, Chennai and Ex-Deputy Director, National Institute of Oceanography inaugurated the Seminar on 1st March 2007. Speaking on this occasion, he gave a brief review of the Marine Microbes and called upon all to work hard and achieve success in their various fields of research. Prof. P.S. Zacharias, Vice Chancellor, Goa University presided over the function. He felicitated Dr. S. Mavinkurve and Dr. Joe D'Souza, Ex-faculty members of the department of Microbiology on this occasion. In his address, he congratulated the department for organizing this seminar and stated that this seminar will provide an opportunity to the science students to achieve excellence in these respective fields. Frontiers in Animal Sciences Lectures

Department of Zoology, Goa University in collaboration with Indian Academy of Sciences, Bangalore organized two days Lecture series in "Frontiers in Animal Sciences" on 5th and 6th February 2007.

The series was inaugurated on 5th February 2007, by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Goa University, Prof. P. S. Zacharias and Prof. S. K. Saidapur, recipient of most coveted S.S. Bhatnagar Award and Vice Chancellor of Karnatak University was the Chief Guest. Prof. A. B. Shanbhag, HOD, Zoology welcomed and introduced the guest.

In these two days, Lectures on Natural Selection and Evolution, Frontiers of Molecular Biology Research, Status of Stem Cell Research and its application, Behavior of Non Human Primates, Primate Societies, Role of Zooplankton and Carbon in monitoring the health of aquatic bodies etc., were dealt by Prof. S. K Saidapur, Prof. R. R. Bhonde, National Centre for Cell Science, Pune, Prof. Mewa Singh, a leading animal psychologist from University of Mysore, Dr. L. Shashidhara from Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad and Dr.Victor Smetacek from Germany.
