The Gomantak Marathi Academy (Porvorim-Goa) has declared Dr. S. M. Tadkodkar, Reader in Marathi, Goa University as an esteemed recipient of literary award for the year 2005. The award has been declared for the collection of literary articles titled HIRWALL AANNI HOARPALL penned by Dr. Tadkodkar.

Lecture by Eminent Pakistani Jurist

Prof. Farooq Hassan, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of Pakistan and advisor to several former Pakistani Prime Ministers, delivered a lecture on 'Constitutionalism, Democracy and Human Rights in Pakistan' on 10th November 2006 at the University. The Lecture, organized by Department of Political Science, Goa University focused on the problems that Pakistan has faced in the realm of Constitution making, where military and civilian governments have shown scant regard for constitutional norms. Prof. Hassan pointed out that emergence of fundamentalist forces had made the situation more complex in a country where democratic forces have been constantly undermined. He stated that return to democracy is essential for peace process to become successful between India and Pakistan. He also mentioned that legal community in Pakistan has been at the forefront of the struggle for democracy and there is a need for India to reach out to the same.

MCA students visit Top IT companies in Pune

The final year students of Master of Computer Applications (MCA) course of Goa University organized an Industrial Study tour to Pune from 18th November to 25th November. The students got a first hand experience of the functioning of the top Indian software companies such as Infosys, Wipro, TCS-TRDDC, Persistent Systems as well as MNCs such as Cognizant, Symantec etc. The students also visited startup companies like GSLabs and Light Bulb Tech partners. They also visited the computing centre of IUCAA (Inter University centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics) wherein they were briefed about the cluster computing and grid computing infrastructure created at IUCAA. The companies that were visited had arranged the presentations on Human Resource Management, software project and process management practices that are followed, areas of technical expertise of the company, skills that are important from employment point of view, quality assurance and quality management processes. Top officials of the companies as well as software development and quality assurance team members interacted with the visiting students.

An alumni meet of the MCA students who are now working in Pune was also organized. The students were accompanied by Mr. Ramrao Wagh and Ms. Yma Pinto as the Faculty Tour Co-ordinators. Dr. V V Kamat, Head of the Department also accompanied the students during the tour. This was the first time such a study tour was organized by the department.

Dr. P. K. Sharma awarded fellowship

Dr. Prabhat Kumar Sharma, Reader in the Department of Botany, Goa University, has been awarded the



Royal Society Fellowship to study at University of Cambridge, UK under Indian National Science Academy – Royal Society Bilateral Exchange Programme and DBT Overseas Associateship. Dr. Sharma will carry out research work for next nine months on regulation of nuclear and chloroplastic genome and cross talk between them, scientifically known as retrograde signaling, under this fellowship. The signaling will help in understanding how genes responsible for photosynthesis, present on nuclear as well as chloroplast genome, functions under variable environmental conditions and regulate the process of photosynthesis. The work may lead to genetically engineered plants to overcome crop productivity losses due to changing external environmental and soil factors.
