Annual Report for the academic year, 1988-89. Education is reconstructing and reorganizing the experiences gained

- from the past, adding 'new' meaning to 'those experiences, and increasing the ability to improve upon what we have learnt. Having these objectives in view, the University did make sone progress during the year under review. The most significant ...change was the restructuring of the courses at the l'ilaSter's' degree level, which was very Successfully implemented during the current year, 1989-90. Our courses were' shaped almost on the pattern of 1.1 ..T. courses with pressure on learning, with continuous evaluation of what was learnt, and with scope for interdisciplinary approach in the choice of the: courses: We feel very happy that this new 'University has launched a new trend. which does not exist anyv.tere In the traditional Universities. The entire credit for this essential reforningoes to alite ac.a.cl.emiCS. who worked ceaselessly hard to evolve
- a very meaningful pattern. Ano_ther perceptible improvement we have had during the year was the early declaration of examination resUlts at the undergraduate level. We finished all our:B .S c. B *Com., examinations by April end, and announced their results by May end, which helped the students community enormously. The year witnessed the first Convocation of the University as well.

Another landmark was in the area Of .Sports Where out New University: won the, Asutesh MUkherj i Shield for football, being the 'champions at the national level. Goa takes to football as does fish to water. Yet our boys had not been seen even at zonal level, and in such circumstances to Win Ali.-India trophy was indeed a matter of great pride. In terms of campus peace and physical faCilitiea, intellectual fervour and academic purSuits, conferences and seminars, .co-curricular and extension services,- and onward march in over-all growth of the University, the year witnessed steady progress.

Portraying in a nutshell, the various achievements mf the University durin q the short period of four years of its existence, it is hooped that the present Annual Report will serve as a re,-.9v reference to all those interested in the affairs of the University.

I would like to placa on record my deepest sense . of gratitude. to the Visitor for his valuable guidance, to the Government of Goa for its -munificient grants, to the University Grants Commission and the Central Ministrdes concerned for the help and assistance in respect of funds extended to this University, to the members of the Executive Council, the Academic Council, the Court, the Planning Board and to the several Boards of Studies for their sincere support and full co-operation at every stage in implementation of the various academic, administrative and other activities undertaken by the University. I feel specially grateful to our faculty, which is the backbone of any University system, for its dedicated efforts to raise the level of our UniVersity. The Vice-Chancellor, on behalf of the Executive Council, has great pleasure i.,)--._,enting to the "Court the Ann; ual Report Of the University for the year 1988,-89 as required under Section 26 of the Goa University Act, 1984.

<u>I - General</u>

Established on 1st June, 1985 as a teaching institution for-higher education, the Goa UniverSity has completed the fourth year of its exis tence. This University had inherited from Bombay University a solid base of education structure which had been built brick by brick over twenty years, since the days of Goa's liberatior, pertaining to every faculty, whether Arts; Science, Corrmerce, Legg, Education, Engineering or Medicine. Due emphasis had been given to technical and professional education, with the result that this State could boast Of having a Dental College, a' Pharmacy College, an E.ng, ineering College; 'a Medical College, a College of Fine .Art, a College of Education, two Law- Colleges, four colleges exclusively for Commerce, five colleges of Arts & Science and one college exclusively for girls. Upon -this solid structure of under-graduate courses was based the Centre of Postgraduate Instruction and.Research (CPIR) with quite a few Departments relevant to the needs of the society. The CPIR, . which had arrangements for post-graduate teaching and instruction in 13 subjects, formed the nucleus of the Goa University.

The University has by now been fully established. 'It Conducted its first public examinations in 19.8S-89 for the students Who were admitted to the first year during the year 1986-87. The term of the first University authorities appointed by the Visitor in exercise of powers vested in him under thg. Goa University Act,1984 expired between June and August 1988 and all the authorities have since been reconstituted in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Statutes. So we have now the re-constituted Executive Council, Academic Council, Court, Planning Board, Final-lite Committee, etc.

The Goa University was very fortunate enough to have a personality of the stature of Dr. Nagendra Singh, President of the International Court of Justice, the Hague, Netherlands as its Chancellor. Unfortunately, with his sad demise on 11th December, 1988, -the University has lost not only his valuable guidance in its academic Matters but a personality of an outstanding calibre.

II. Faculties and Academic Programmes

- a) Till 1987-88 the following teaching departments were functioning in 'the University: English, Hindi,
 Marathi, French, Economics, History, Political
 Science, Sociology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Physics,
 Chemistry, Microbiology, Marine Science, Geology,
 Kbnkani, Portuguese, Commerce and Computer Science
 & Technology.
- b)During the year under reference two More departments were created. These, are the departments of Marine Biotechnology and Management Studies.
- c) This University is one of the 55 Universities in the .country selected by the University Grants Commission for the:betting up of an Academic Staff College which started, functioning early in 1988-89. The jurisdiction of this staff'college extends not only to the area of this University, but also to that of the Shivaji University and four districts under the Uhiversity of Bombay.
- d) A Centre for Latin American Studies sanctioned by the University Grants Commission, has also started functioning from the current academic year. To begin with, courses in History and Political Science of the Latin American countries have been offered at the M.A. level. Similarly, a Centre for Women's Studies also sanctioned by the Urliversity Grants Commission has also started functioning in the Department of Sociology.

The HeIme SCience College for Girls, which was originally started three years back by the All India Women's Conference (Goa Branch), but had to be dis-E..'.4_1_iatc:•-.1 because of certain, important • reasons, was re-started' by the Government of Goa from the Current academic year.

- f) The University plans to set 17..p in the near future a Department of Ecology and Environment Sciences. Recently, the University Grants Commission has called upon this University to put up a proposal for starting a course of study leading to the degree of M.Sc. in. Electronics. The University Grants Commission has shexan willingness to provide financial assistance, if the University agrees to start such a course. This matter is being examined in detail.
- g) An important development in the academic field is the restructuring of the courses leading to the post-graduate degrees in Arts, Science and Commerce. A Committee is also working for similar restructuring of the under-graduate courses in Arts, Science and Commerce.
- h) The University held a series of seminars and conferences bearing on the history and culture of Goa and kirought out a few publications such as Goa Wins Freedom, Goan Society Through the Ages, Goa Cultural Trends, Essays in Goan History and India and Mozambique.

III. Construction Programme

The construction activity: of the University's new carnpus., on the Sambolim-Taleigao Plateau is going on with full speed. The basic infrastructural facilities like roads, electricity, water supply, sewerage etc. are either coal° leted or nearing completion. The administrative off ices f sc.] Ity blocks and a large number of residential houses are also under construction. It is expected that the administration will shift to its new block on the campus before the end of the academic year 1989-90. Most of the residential quarters are also expected to be ready- by the

close of the Seventh Plan. The blocks for the Pure Sciences and Applied Sciences faculties are expected to be ready by thebegthitiang of 1990-81. Work on construction of a play-ground alangwith a 400 metres running track is also going on at top speed.

IV. Financial Position

- a) The eStimated expenditure for the year under review i.e. 1988-89 worked out on the plan side to Rs.574.41 lakhs and on the non-plan side Rs,43.30 lakhs. These amounts are to be met almost entirely from the grants provided by the Government of Goa, with the except-ion of small amount to be raised by way of fees and other miscellaneous incomes. The 'actual expenditure incurred during the year amounted to Rs.524.04 lakhs on the plan side and Rs.56.07 lakhs on the non-plan side.
- b) A grant of Rs.70.70 lakhs 'has been provided by the . Ministry of Science & Technology, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, for setting up a post-graduate course of study leading to the degree of M.Sc. in Biotechnology.
- c) The Khadi & Village Commission, Bombay, has provided a small grant of Rs.5.00 lakhs for a research project to the Department of Microbiology.
- 'd) The University Grants Commission sanctioned, assistance for construction works of the Women's Hostel and Teachers Transit accommodation and for this purpose sum of Rs.32.50 lakhs has been earmarked in the U.G.C.'s Seventh Plan.
- e) The Department of Physics has received from the U.G.C. for research in Superconductivity an amount of fts.20.DC1 lakhs as equipment grant and Rs.0.25 lakhs towards contingency and travel grants.

CHAPTER - III

Centre of Historical Research

The Centre which was established in 1978 is recognised by the Goa University as a Post-Graduate Institute for historical research and for guiding students for research work leading to $P\ h$. D . D e g r e e i n H i s t o r y .

It is run in a building owned by the Goa) Cavier Co.Pvt. Ltd., whose Chairman is-also the Chairman of/the Centre. The ground floor of the building consists of lirious offices itwo Conference rooms, one lounge, a Computer-c-um-microfilm room and a reprograohy room. The auditorium-cum-museum and the Historical Research Library are located on the upperfloor. There is also a Reading room and a Manuscript room attached to the Library.

Research facilities

The research facilities provided by the Institute are wJ_- ; tely utilised by the post-graduate students and nes e ar ch scholars, of the Goa University and its affiliated colleges as well as by scholars from outs F^- Goa and from abroad.

The Centre has a collection of nearly 12,500 books .170 cyclosyled volumes of Government reports and various history seminars, 41 volumes of xeroxed archival material and 147 loose maps Of historical and geographical value. The journal section., of the library holds 392 titles.

The Portuguese documents of Mhomai house papers numbering over 100,000 papers have been arranged chromologically into files

The microfilm section has about 8,500 documents on microfilms and more are being added from time to time.

The mini-museum of the Centre concentrates on Goan Christain Art and includes also valuable collections of postal stamps, coins and rredallioris.

CHAPTER IV OTHER ACTIVITIES

A. LIBRARY

The University Library came into existence with the establishment of the Goa University in June, 1985. In fact, the start was made by annexing the library of the Centre of Post Graduate Instruction and Research, University of Bombay to the Goa University Library, whereby a collection of 37627 books and periodicals formed the basis of the present Library.

This section of the University is actually the central point of educational and research activities as it caters to the needs of various post—graduate students, research scholars and faculty members. To this effect, it is being replenished with newer and latest additions, year after year. Today, the total collection has reached to 53025 volumes of books, covering a number of disciplines under Humanities, Science and Social Science covering wide range of subjects like Philosophy, Sociology, Politics, Economics, Education, Languages, and Literature in English, Hindi, Marathi, Konkani, French and Portuguese, MathematiCs, Computer Science, Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Marine Science, Microbiology, Management Studies, Arts, History and Biographies.

The Library has a separate journal section which subscribes 428 journals. Some journals are also received as gratis. Besides, the Library consists of thesis and several dissertations. More journals are being procured so as to strengthen the research activities of the University. In addition, the special needs of Historical Research are catered through Professor P.S.S. Pissurlencar Collection Library which consists of 4486 books, journals, documents, photostat copies and microfilms. The Goa University has the following collections of books and journals which enrich th, UllivErsity's -corpus.

- a) About 610 books from thr_ heirs of Professor Vithalrao Sukhthankar.
- b) About 80 books in Portuguese from Dr.Shridhar Tama.

- c) A collection of about 467 books in Philosophy (of Prof. D'Andraders collection) from the Bombay Philosophical Society, Bombay)
- d) About 519 books in Portuguese mainly concerned with Portuguese Literature of the 19th Century from Advocate Paul Mascarenhas in the memory of his late father.
- e) About 146 149 books in French and Portuguese from Prof. G.V. Kantak.
- 'f) Collection of books/periodicals, pamphlets etc. 721 donated by Shri Carmo Azavedo on Goa and by Goan Authors.
- g) About 324 books mostly on Ayurveda from Dr.Raguvir P. Sinary
- h) A collection of books numbering 1676 mostly Marathi from Shri Wamanrao Kundaikar.
- i) A collection of books numbering 289 mostly Portuguese from Shri Xavier De Monte Furtado.
- j) A Collection of 125 books mostly Portuguese from the Xavier Centre for Historical Research, Porvorim.

Also the USIS Library, Alliance Francaiso and British Council Library donate books regularly to the University Library. This includes 190 books specially in Latin American Studies in the USIS collection.

Working Days:

The Library is kept open for all the days except Sunday, throughout the year, besides the normal working hours of the Library, the reading rooms are kept open for extended hours so as to facilitate its use by the readers. During the examination days, the Library is kept open even on Sundays and Public Holidays.

The normal timings of the Library are 9.00 a,m. to 6.30 p.m. on week days and 10.00 a.m. to 5.45 p.m. on 1st, 3rd and 5th Saturdays of the month.

Readers and use of Library:

The University has 800 registered readers including the staff members and several casual visitors. Inter Library exchange of books and journals is encouraged and the journals are regularly exchanged with the Library of National Institute of Oceanography.

Teachers and students of the local colleges are encouraged to use the University Library and the reference and borrowing facility is extended to them. rh.D. Students are issued ten books at a time, as a special facility to boost research activity in the University.

The Library continues to receive presentation of books/periodicals from a number of persons and institutions.

Other Materials:

Several maps are also collected by the Goa University Library.

BIBLIOGRAPHICAL and Documentation Service:

Bibliographies of reading materials available in the Library were compiled and supplied on dem-and to staff members on special subjects. A list with the latest addition is circulated to the University Departments. Recently, an exhaustive list of periodicals holdings of the Library has been published.

University Bindery:

Bindery unit been opened to cater to the needs Of day to day mending/binding of books and journals.

Classification and Cataloguing:

Books are classified according to Dewey Decimal Classification _ and subject and author (Main) catalogues are maintained. There are separate catalogues for collection. Moreover the library collection (Books & Journals) is on computer now. Serious Readers/Research

B. KONKAN_I ENCYCLOPAEDIA

The University has undertaken a project for preparation of Konkani Encyclopaedia to cater to the needs of the scholars as well as of the common man knowing Kohkani.

Encyclo7aedia information will be classified into various subjects. The Encyclopaedia will be of courso, contain entries regarding general knowledge covering the whole world, but emphasis will be laid on information regarding the konkani, speaking territories, their people history, geography, art and culture, customs and manners, etc.

The Encyclopaedia will consist of 3000 pages with three volumes of 1000 pages each. The source material will be taken from Encyclopaedias in English, French, Portuguese, Hindi, Marathi, Kannada etc. and from the specialised works, but original articles on local topics that have not obviously been already dealt with in other works, will be written by the scholars conversant with the subject.

This project will be first of its kind in the history of Konkani Language and will go a long way in bringing general knowledge to the doors of the common konkani men.


