



Dean's Report

A meeting of the Faculty Board in Social Sciences was held on **09.03.2017** at 3.30p.m. in room no. BG-47, Department of History. It discussed and decided about the scheduling of classes in the Core and Optional courses in various Departments/Centres under the Faculty to facilitate students to move across the Departments/Centres to opt for Optional courses. Further the members were requested to apply for funded research projects, and publish in standard/refereed journals to enhance the profile of the Faculty. This was felt crucial to implement the suggestion of the NAAC accreditation team (2014), and to prepare for the next round of accreditation. Besides, the increased participation of teachers and students in the various VRPP courses was sought. The members were briefed about the preparation made for the "Seminar on Doctoral Research in Social Sciences" to be organised by the Faculty on 22.03.2017. The members were asked to think on the possibility of establishing a School of Social Sciences.

Seminar

A "Seminar on Doctoral Research in Social Sciences" was organised on 22.03.2017 (10a.m. to 5.15p.m.), under the UGC XII Plan Grant. The seminar was planned to provide a platform for the research scholars of Goa University under the Faculty of Social Sciences to present their research work before the Resource Persons. The fundamental idea was to follow the interdisciplinary approach in Social Science research, and emphasise on research methodology and perspectives of research. Further it was to review the progress of their research work, and provide suggestions to enhance the quality of their research. Prof. VarunSahni, Vice Chancellor, Goa University, inaugurated the seminar.

This year we had an opportunity to interact with Prof. Ajit Yoganathan, founder member of Biomedical engineering group at Georgia Tech University, USA, who gave lecture on Opportunities of Higher learning. He was passionated by our thriving progress in the various areas of Natural Science and suggested for joint collaboration. Also, we had visitor Dr. Andreas Hoser from HelmoholtzZentrum Berlin, Germanywho gave talk on Neutron Powder Diffraction Study of Phase Transitions. Dr. Manoranjan Kumarfrom S.N. Bose National Center for Basic Sciences, Kolkata delivered a talk Multipolar Phase in a Frustrated Ferromagnetic Spin-1/2 Chain. INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMES/SCHEMES

3.1 Research Development & Resources Mobilisation Cell (RDRM)

RDRM Cell acts as a facilitator and record keeper of various research projects and consultancies carried out by the faculty members of Goa University.

The researchprojects are sanctioned to individual faculty members by various Central government and state government funding agencies like DST-SERB (Science and Engineering Research Board), Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), New Delhi, University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), New Delhi, Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad, Department of Biotechnology (DBT), New Delhi, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), Bangalore, Board of Research & Nuclear Science (BRNS), Mumbai, Department of Science, Technology & Environment, Govt. of Goa, etc.

In addition, Science Departments of the University receive funding under Special Assistance Programme (SAP) of the University Grants Commission and Fund for Improvement S & T Infrastructure in Universities and Higher Education Institutions (FIST) Programme of Department of Science and Technology Govt. of Goa.

In the year 2016-17, **04** sponsored projects and **05** Consultancywere sanctioned to faculty members of the University. Additionally **26** projects are currently on going and **19** programme has been submitted for funding to various funding agencies.

In the present year RDRM hosted a meeting of delegation of European Research and Innovation officers with the faculty members of Goa University to learn about various opportunities European Union provides in Research and Innovation.

RDRM also provides financial assistance to submit a research project as well as travel support (where required) to faculty to defend/present progress of their research project.

3.2 Remote Sensing Laboratory (RSL)

A Remote Sensing Laboratory has been established with financial assistance from Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The facilities of the laboratory include hardware and software necessary for image processing. SEADAS has been applied to carry out Image processing. An interdisciplinary course has been introduced across the different faculties where remote sensing technique has application. The laboratory provides hands on training to students who opt for interdisciplinary course on remote sensing and research and thus cater to the county's need for trained manpower in this field. All the instruments necessary for in-situ observations of radiance and irradiance, spectrophotometer for analysing the optically active constituents from samples and sunphotometer for measuring aerosol optical depth have been procured through R&D projects funded by various National agenceis. At present there are many R&D projects funded by different agencies like Naval Research Bard, Space Applications Centre, Space Physics Laboratory of VSSC, ISRO and Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Service of Ministry of Earth Sciences, Delhi. All these projects are carried out by Department of Marine Sciences for which the laboratory has been used extensively.

3.3 Study India Programme (SIP):

The SIP is a programme offered to a group of foreign students wanting to pursue study in India to earn credits. The Universities/institutions desirous of sending a batch consisting not less than five students are required to contact the SIP Coordinator to prepare and sign a Memorandum of Understanding containing the course outline, time-schedule, credit transfer, and fee structure. The MOU is a prerequite for launching the SIP. The University does not entertain inquiries of students not supported by their respective Universities/Institutions.

During the period under report, 05 students from the Nihon University, Japan participated in the study India Programme at Goa University for a period of six months. The 32 credits earned by the students are transferred to their parent University. i.e. Nihon University, Japan.

3.4 Extra Mural Studies and Extension Services (EMS & ES)

The extension activities of the Board were carried out both through University Departments and affiliated colleges

- 1. Extension Services carried out through **University Departments**:
 - a) The Department of Political Science organized a day long programme at **Veling Panchayat** with regards to **participatory democracy**.
 - b) The Department of **History** took the students of **Government High School**, **Satari**, and **Azmane High School**, **Neura**, on **heritage walks** to **Chandor and Loutolim**, to give **ninety** –**five rural students** a glimpse of Goa through the Ages.
 - c) The Department of Earth Science conducted two programmes on Water harvesting and Conservation. The first programme was organized at Mount Mary's Higher Secondary School. Chinchinim, which more than 120 students from the Arts, Science and Commerce streams and a couple of teachersof the school attended the same. The second programme was organized at Viscount High School, Pernem, for students of Class VIII and IX. In both the programmes, there was an interactive session on rain water harvesting and conservation followed by a demonstration of a working model of water harvesting. On this occasion posters related to the same were displayed.
- 2. Extension Services carried out through Affiliated Colleges:
 - a) Dnyanprasarak Mandal College of Commerce, conducted a one day workshop on Popularization of Science Education in Goa which was attended by seventy **students** from various Higher Secondary Schools and High Schools of Goa. .On this occasion a talk cum demonstration by **Ms Anupa Khorjuvear**, J. E., GEDA was organized.
 - In the second session, **Prof. E. De'Sa**, spoke on "What next after the 12.", He also spoke on his research work "What is glass and how to understand it in a better way".
 - In the third session participants were taken around to various science labs, which gave them an exposure to the various research facilities and instrumentation available in the college.
 - During the post lunch session Mr. Sagar Sakordekar, of SRS Academy, Ponda, spoke on "Enjoy Maths with Vedic Mathematics".
 - In the last session the National Teachers Award recipient, **Shri. Vijay Kumar Verekar**, retired Asst. Headmaster spoke on "**Learning basics concepts in Physics with household material**".
 - b) Carmel College for Women Nuvem, organized a sensitization program on Environment on 9th March for sixty, 8 th Std students of Mae dos Pobres School, Nuvem with **Dr. Manoj Borkar** and **Shri. Jose Andrade** as the resource persons
 - Staff members **Aldina Gomes and Gladys D'Souza** met and **interacted** with **unwed mothers** at Sister Adores House in Pathiapur, Nuvem.
 - On 20th March there was a full day First Aid course held in collaboration with the Red Cross Society
 - From 20th-22nd March a nutrition course was conducted for thirty participants from Nuvem and surrounding areas as well as for college students.
 - On 26th March Medical camp for Women was organised wherein test for diabetes, ENT, bone density, PAP smear were conducted for nearly fifty Women, with eight Doctors and Nurses in attendance
 - c) Shri Mallikarjun College of Arts and Commerce conducted a free medical camp at Cola Village Panchayat, Canacona. A total number of 225 villagers took advantage of the camp which offered bone density test, diabetes detection, uric acid test, orthopedic examination. Eighty one new cases were detected; Nineteen related to diabetes, fourteen to uric acid, Twelve to high blood pressure twenty to ostopenia and sixteen to osteoporosis.

3.5 Earth Science & Technology Cell (ESTC)/Centre of Excellence in Marine Microbiology (CoE)

The Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) supports basic and applied research in Ocean and Atmospheric Science and Technology in Universities through establishment of ESTCs. Nine such specific ESTCs have been set up in different institutions of the country that take up projects submitted by Universities, National laboratories and Indian Institutes of Technology, etc. Goa University has been identified to set up one such specific ESTC in the area of Marine Microbiology.

The objectives of the Cell are to strengthen academic and scientific work in the area of Marine Microbiology. The Cell functions under the guidance of the Management Board constituted by Ministry of Earth Sciences, with the Vice Chancellor, Goa University, as the Chairperson and Research Coordinator, ESTC as Member Secretary. The MB meets to discuss, guide and direct the activities of the Cell.

3.6 Computerisation and It Infrastructure (DEITI)

As usual, DEITI has carried out its activities during the period for all kinds of audio-visual productions of various events in the University. The major events include the VRPP lectures by the renowned Speakers, National seminars, conferences, Guest lectures, University Annual Convocation, and University Elections.

DEITI has successfully completed the professional commercial production of the annual 'Kaleidoscope Quiz - VII', where the students from various Higher Secondary Schools in Goa participated. Fifteen episodes were produced in five languages, viz., Portuguese, Konkani, Hindi, Marathi & French which were telecast on a local TV channel.

Recording Studio and post production facility was utilized for production of Audio CD "Vitthal Dindi" for Vitthal Kala and Sanskrutik Mandal, Akhada -St. Estev.

29th Annual Convocation, held on 25th April 2017 was recorded using four camera setup and the LIVE telecast of the proceedings of the Convocation was made available by DEITI through University website.

18th IIRS (Indian Institute of Remote Sensing) Outreach Programme on "Basics of Remote Sensing, Geographical Information System and Global Navigation Satellite System" was successfully conducted in DEITI Studio for the students of Earth Science Department from 22nd August to 18th November 2016.A-View platform was used for two-way interaction between the resource persons at Dehradun hub and the participants at the DEITI studio.

3.7 Workstation for Mircodata from Census

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for setting up the workstation was signed by Joint Director, Directorate of Census Operations, Goa and Registrar, Goa University. The workstation was established in the Goa University Library building. The objective of setting up microdata station was to permit qualified researchers optimum use of anonymized sample microdata from census for in-depth research. Workstation enables the researchers to have access to micordata which is not published by census. This facility would be available to all including those who are not part of the University system. Workstation does not permit the researchers to take out or copy the data. The researcher would be allowed to process the sample micro data using the software available in the workstation and generate the tables for use. Only computer printout of the tables so generated will be allowed to be taken out of the work station. Workstation has a fully air-conditioned lab with 5 computer terminals and STATA software re to access and process the microdata. The workstation can provide highly useful data for social sciences researchers in Goa and neighboring States.

4.1 Estate Division

4.2 Computerisation and IT Infrastructure

The Software Requirement Specification (SRS) for University Management system was successfully completed and development of the software was in advance stage of implementation. The admission to all the PG, PhD programmes was done through online system by integrating to online Payment gateway. Modification in the existing programs & development of new programs were carried on in the Examination system.

A professional Data Centre with Smart Cabinets was set up in the Computer Centre. All the important and delicate servers were placed there with proper security.

The network connectivity with optic fibre cable was extended on the campus under NMEICT scheme. This has upgraded the network infrastructure by connecting the newly constructed premises. A separate network was being established for exclusive usage for about 60 Cameras to be installed at various locations on the campus. The monitoring station for monitoring all the surveillance cameras was set up with required hardware in the Admin building.

4.3 Library

The Goa University Library and Information Centre was established in the year 1985. It was then part of the Post Graduate Centre of the Bombay University (CPIR). From its modest collection of books, this library has developed into a huge library with modern facilities.

At present the library has a collection of 169496 books and 10983 volumes of bound journals. The library subscribes to 263 periodicals out of which 87 are foreign journals. The library is getting a large number of periodicals on gratis too.

The library is automated for its routine works and the entire collection is bar-coded. The Library services are being done thorugh an Open Source Integrated Library management Software KOHA. Users can easily get awareness on the availability of books and they can reserve and renew the books themselves through this software. The library also offers access to general reference materials like the Encyclopedia Britannica and Encyclopedia of Science and Technology, World Book Encyclopedia, Oxford English Dictionary.

The Library website can be accessed at the url www.library.unigoa.ac.in. This website is developed suing an Open Source Content Management System Drupal. We have developed a huge Knowledge Portal with it, which links to multifarious information resources on the Internet. All online resources of the library are linked in this page. They include all INFONET Digital Library resources, Encyclopedia Britannica (Academic Edition), Indiastat.Com. We have added 216 e-books on various subjects to our collection. Huge list of online resources are also available in this page.

UGC Infonet Consortia

Goa University Library, being the first phase member of the UGC Infonet Programme, avails the IP authenticated e-journals from the Inter University Centre of the UGC namely the INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad. Goa University stands at the top most ranks in the usage of these e-journals. The library also has access to the Sci-finder database.

Institutional Repository

The Goa University Library has digitized its 677 thesis and uploaded in the Digital repository created using the Open Source Software DSpace. We have started uploading postgraduate dissertations and grey literature related to the University.

Goa University Library had a major role in the development of Konkani Encyclopedia using the Konkani Vishwakosh published by the University. The entire encyclopedia volumes were digitized and copies are also available in our repository for download.

Goa University Library conducted a short term course in Literature Searching and Academic Writing in collaboration with the UGC Academic Staff College, Goa University. Workshops on Research Methodology and Library Automation were conducted in the Library premises.

4.7 U. G. C. Human Resource Development Centre

The UGC- Human Resource Development Centre Scheme is an outcome of NPE (1986). The NPE, in its programme of action, makes a pointed reference to the crucial link between teacher motivation and quality of education. Since teachers occupy a key position in the education system, the quality, competence and character of teachers are of utmost importance. They influence the standard of education and thus contribute to national development. The UGC-HRDC was established with the objective of acting as an agency to bring about changes and

development in education. It is meant to involve itself in the improvement in the Management of Higher Education, and to bring about a closer linkage between society and Higher through meaning study and research.

The UGC-HRDC at Goa University has been conducting Orientation Courses since its establishment from February 1988.

In addition to Orientation Programme, Refresher Courses and Short Term Courses, the UGC-ASC has been regularly organizing Seminars/Conference/Interaction Programes/Meets and other academic activities.

In keeping with the recent advances in information Technology, the UGC has given a major thrust to IT and its applications. A Computer Lab has been set up with special grants from the UGC. Participants are given basic training along with hands-on experience with Computers. They are also helped in exploiting the informative resources on Internet and in the use of other technologies. Refresher Courses participants are trained to use software packages pertaining to their particular discipline.

Till date the UGC-HRDC at Goa University has complete 95th Orientation Programmes and 185th Refresher Courses eatering 3388 and 5506 participants respectively beside this, there was also short term courses. During the year 2016-17 the UGC-HRDC conducted 2 Orientation Program, 3 Refresher Courses in subject of English, Library and Information Science and Environmental Studies (ID), 1 Short Term Course Research Methodology for Science students and Training Programme for University Officers. Thus the year 2016-17 was productive, active and was very helpful for several teachers both at UG and PG level belonging to various states of the country and also University Officers. All the courses were well appreciated by the participants, resource persons and administrators.

Goa University provides hostel facility for women students on the University campus. 4.11 Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

During this academic year, IQAC continued to function in the areas such as

- Information gathering, monitoring and dissemination;
- Participation in the national and international ranking survey agencies and also by other agencies;
- Generating awareness on quality consciousness within University;
- Outreach and publications. Specific activities that were undertaken were as follows:

Information gathering, monitoring and dissemination

The Cell continually monitor the publications of the faculty and add it to the institutional repository that is open on the Internet. This makes the dataset of publications most up-to-date for internal consumption as well as provides wide access to the contributions of the University adding to the visibility.

The Cell also continued to collect departmental and individual level information from the self appraisal reports submitted by the faculty members at the end of academic year. This has helped in building other databases such as events organized in various departments; sponsored projects; presentation of papers at conferences, etc.; students joined in doctoral programmes, etc. From the information so gathered, IQAC assists the Annual Report committee to generate departmental reports and makes it available on the website of the University.

Participation in surveys

During the academic year of the report, IQAC provided information to different ranking agencies such as: NIRF, India Today, The Week and QS BRICS University Rankings. This has helped University in ranking at significant levels nationally and internationally. IQAC also responded to other questionnaires those of: Academia-Industry survey,

Association of Indian Universities, National Centre for Promotion of Employment for Disabled People (NCPEDP), Survey on Framework of University-Industry Linkages in Research (PHD survey), National Survey on Resources Devoted to Scientific and Technological (S&T) Activities 2015-16 (SnT Survey), University Grants Commission, (Pay Review Committee, 2016).

Generating awareness on quality consciousness within University

The Faculty and Officer at IQAC participated in interaction with the non-faculty members (Asst. Registrar level) of the University organized by HRDC as well as delivered lectures at Orientation programmes and Refresher courses organized by UGC-HRDC at Goa University on quality issues. A paper was also presented at the Conference on Benchmarking Procedures and Practices for Quality Enhancement in Higher Education at Christ University, Bengaluru during 22-24 November 2016 on "Assessing Quality in Higher Education Institutions in India: An Alternate View"

4.12 Swachh Bharat Abhiyan Activities

The Goa University has appointed a working committee comprising of twelve members in order to implement "Swachh Barat, Swachh Goa" activities on the Goa University Campus. This working committee has taken various initiatives to achieve the goals as per vision of our Honourable Chancellor and Governor of Goa.

At the onset, as per recommendations of the above working committee the Goa University procured dustbins in various sizes to be placed at all strategic locations on the campus. These dustbins are regularly cleared by the staff of the Estate Administration so as to keep the areas free from litter.

The Goa University Campus has been declared a plastic free zone for which the collection and disposal of plastic waste is of outmost importance. In view of the above, as per recommendations of the committee the University has constructed wire mesh enclosures 3 mtrs. X 3 mtrs. Size built on concrete platform and open to sky. These enclosures have been provided with lockable gates and with an easy access for the collection vehicle.





It was also proposed by the above working committee that all correspondences may indicate the desired logo and the Goa University Library has volunteered in designing of the same.

Cleaning programmes in the Goa University Campus are being undertaken by the various departments / sections under guidance of the respective heads. The respective departments ensures that after cleaning the material is stored in suitable garbage disposal bags which are then collected by the garbage disposal vehicle. Care is being taken by the respective departments that this stored garbage is not littered by pests / dogs. The expenses incurred during the activity by the concerned HOD / Sectional Head is being made under their own budgetary provision.

As per directives receive from the Raj Bhawan, The University has observed Swachhta Pakhwada during the specified period in the month of September and November. During these periods, the students and the staff have been sensitized about the importance of cleanliness and sanitation. Various programmes were held in order to achieve the goals. As a part of this programme, HOD from the department of Biotechnology Dr. Savita Kerkar presented a motivational lecture on the importance of "Swachhta" and encourage everyone to inculcate the spirit of cleanliness in their lives. A special emphasis was given on ways of keeping laboratories tidy. Subsequently all the students, research scholars and the staff members participated in cleaning of the laboratories, classrooms, Office, Library, corridors, auditorium etc. The students and the Teachers cleaned the entire premises with vigour & enthusiasm and the entire waste was suitably disposed off. A programme titled "wealth from waste" was also organised for the students where in art work created from unwanted junk was displayed.





The Department of Konkani, Goa University organized Swach Bharat Abhiyan campaign in Goa University campus. Forty Seven students and three staff members of Department of Konkani took part in this campaign with full enthusiasm. The areas around the Faculty Blocks, Canteens, Guest Houses, Library, Hostels, Shopping Centre, Administrative Building, Examination Building, Jubilee Hall and Health Centre were cleaned. The students collected a lot of plastic wrappers, polythene bags, plastic bottles, waste paper, paper plates, and gathered the same outside the Administrative building of Goa University. The faculties of Department of Konkani, staff & all the students took active and wholesome part in this campaign.

II. Swachhatam Mahavidyalaya Samman

Success of any learning programme offered by any academic institution depends on how best and appropriately the entire environment of the academic institution is maintained and managed. The more the students/teachers feel comfortable, the more will be the learning/teaching outcome. Comfort includes providing a healthy environment in and around the academic institution. The facilities management system of any academic institution must revolve around providing complete comfort to the students, to the teaching community and to the administrative supporting staff, being the three important stakeholders considered as crucial for the very success of any academic institution, in fact the three layers of the pyramid of any academic institution.

Intune with this very basic foundation of providing healthy environment to all the three stakeholders, **Her Excellency Mridula Sinha**, Governor of Goa has come up with a new scheme of awarding **Swachchatam Mahavidyala Samman** (for the first time in India) under the **Swachch Bharat Mission** to encourage, motivate, and institutionalize the concept of cleanliness among the students, teaching community, and administrative supporting staff from undergraduate level. At this stage, the student community can be shaped to be good citizens with a mind-set to make the concept of 'Clean and Green India' a reality. The award will definitely motivate the institutions that are really practicing the concept of cleanliness from inception, and can be a bench mark to other institutions to emulate. The overall aspect considered while evaluating the institutions is the existing practices followed to maintain good and

efficient environment which positively affects the health and learning of the student/teaching community. The practice of cleanliness must be on a regular and continuous basis as the concept of cleanliness leads to overall improvement of the credibility of academic institutions.

In order to identify the best institution in the State of Goa having a planned and well managed system of cleanliness, a Committee was constituted and the Committee essentially employed **ten criteria** required to be followed as per the *Swachch Bharat Mission*.

These aspects include:

1. Stop littering and dispose garbage properly:

[Garbage disposal practice and maintenance of the premises]

2. Sort your garbage

[Garbage segregation practice/Biodegradable v/s non-biodegradable]

3. Maintain Hygiene

[Overall ambiance, class rooms, office, toilets, canteen, etc.]

4. Re-Use and Re-cycle

[How the 2nd aspect is processed further]

5. Say NO to Plastic

[Ability to avoid use of plastics – connected to 2nd and 4th aspects]

6. Consume what you need

[Waste minimization practice – connected to 2nd, 4th and 5th aspects]

7. Water care

[Minimal usage, recycling and rainwater harvesting practices]

8. Reduce your carbon footprints

[Facilities usage practices – AC, vehicles, etc. leading to Greenhouse Effect]

9. Check Air Pollution

[Waste and garbage disposal practices – connected to 2nd, 4th and 5th aspects]

10. Environmental education and tree plantation

[Afforestation and Reforestation practices]

These ten aspects were categorised in to five sections, viz.,

- Section I Overall Ambience consists of 15 statements of 4 points each (total 60 points),
- Section II Overall Maintenance & Management consists of 15 statements of 2 points each (total 30 points),
- Section III Overall Water Management consists of 10 statements of 4 points each (total 40 points),
- Section IV Overall Management of Environment consists 10 statements of 2 points each (total 20 points) and
- Section V Overall Result of Environment Education consists of 5 statements of 4 points each (total 20 points).

The total points allotted comes to 170. Each member scored the institutions individually and then the average score is obtained. This is finally converted in to weighted average score by considering additional 10 criteria, if any institution fulfils all the 10 criteria, 100% weightage is given. The overall Weighted Average Score (WAS) was computed and a report was prepared. This exercise of evaluation and assessment was carried out in with complete objectivity.

The present report is classified into three categories as follows:

- Sarvaswachh Academic Institution in Goa [Private and Government Institutions separately]

This classification is aimed to assist the low ranked institutions to upgrade their existing facilities w.r.t. cleanliness and security in their campus and improve their ranking in the near future.

V M Salgaocar Institute of International Hospitality Education scored the highest Weighted Average Score during the year 2016-2017, i.e., 143 out of possible 170 with 100% weightage.

Some of the suggestions by the Committee were as follows:

- To motivate the institutions in improving the standard, advised to give Certificates of Appreciation as well as a Cash Prize to the top three (3) institutions among the 54institutions.
- The result of the inspection **MUST** form part of the conditions to be verified by the Affiliation Enquiry Committee for the purpose of ensuring the health, safety, and security of the students as well as teachers and administrative supporting staff.
- If this practice of inspection is going to be continued on annual basis, all institutions **MUST** be included for inspection, and surprise inspection **MUST** be carried out.
- It is advisable to constitute the committee with youngsters so that inspecting the entire institutions (some of them are 3-4 storied buildings) becomes easy without much difficulty.
- It is advisable to provide honorarium to the committee members as it is similar to any Affiliation Enquiry Committee visit.






Graph-1. Student Strenghth in Professional Colleges: Year Wise Male, Female and Total

Graph-3. 7.7 Total Students Strength in Colleges 2016-17: General and Professional






