

Shri Damodar Mauzo is a novelist, short story writer, critic and scriptwriter from Goa. He has several published works to his credit and is the recipient of the Sahitya Akademi award in the year 1983 for his novel *Karmelin*.

Among the books he has

authored are four novels, six collections of Short fiction, two books of biological sketches, three books for children besides works in translation and some edited books. A voluminous book of the saga of Konkani language and literature, that chronicles the hardships faced by Konkani at the hands of the Portuguese colonialists, was published as recently as 2019. *Ink of Dissent*, is a collection of essays written in English was published the same year.

One of the widely translated writers with his novel Karmelin translated into as many as fourteen languages. Many of his stories are translated into several Indian languages as also into English, Portuguese and French. One of the collections of his stories, Teresa's Man, was nominated for the Frank O' Connor International Award in the year 2015. He was recently awarded the Podar Ratna Award by his Alma Mater, R.A. Podar College of Commerce & Economics, Mumbai. Mauzo has written award-winning screenplays and dialogues for Konkani films. His stories have also been adapted for the telefilms in Hindi for Doordarshan. Winner of several literary awards that include the Sahitya Akademi award, Katha award, State Cultural Award, etc. he was a member of the Executive Board and Finance Committee of Sahitya Akademi, New Delhi for the term 2003-07. He has served as a jury member for many national level literary awards. He is the cofounder and co-curator of the Goa Arts and Literature Festival and a founding-member of PEN-South India, an International writers' collective.
