STATE RESOURCE CENTRE FOR WOMEN DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN'S STUDIES, GOA UNIVERSITY

Collaboration between the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University and the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India (MWCD, GoI) goes back many years. Some of the highlights of this association include the preparation of the *Situational Analysis of Women and Girls in Goa* in 2005 for the National Commission for Women and *Sanghmitra, Convergence Project around Adolescent Health and Rights* for the National Mission for the Empowerment of Women (NMEW) in 2014 among many others.

The Department of Women's Studies at Goa University also has close linkages with the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Goa (DWCD, GoG). Our faculty members have and continue to serve on the Goa State Commission for Women and other advisory bodies of the DWCD, GoG. It was an extension of this collaboration that the Goa University signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the DWCD, GoG and today the State Resource Centre for Women is housed within the Department of Women's Studies at Goa University. It is only fitting that a Department that is already engaged with students and the community on issues related to women, namely the Department of Women's Studies at Goa University is entrusted to coordinate and help implement this Scheme, now under the Mahila Shakti Kendra (MSK), namely the State Resource Centre for Women (SRCW) in Goa, with its 60:40 cost sharing arrangement between the MWCD, GoI and the DWCD, GoG.

The five positions namely 1) State Project Coordinator, 2) Specialist Gender, 3) Specialist Training, 4) Research Officer, and 5) Assistant (Training & Documentation), sanctioned under the scheme were appointed in September 2018 and this report is of the work done during the brief period of September 2018 to March 2019.

Within the Goa University, the SRCW functions under the Department of Women's Studies and the communication with the MWCD, GoI is through the DWCD, GoG. The setting up of the State Level Task Force is currently under process with the DWCD, GoG. However in the interim, faculty of the Department of Women's Studies, serve as the Task Force to co-ordinate, advice and monitor the work of the SRCW. The State Resource Centre for Women - Goa is envisioned as a state level convergence of academia, state interventions, civil society initiatives and the whole community to bring about a change in the status of women in Goa and that will ultimately effect a better life for all.

Part I: Report and Activities Organised

1. State Resource Centre for Women Inauguration and Symposium on 'Working with Women in Goa: Avenues and Challenges'

The State Resource Centre for Women inaugural event took place on 8 September 2018 in the Conference Hall at Goa University and included a Symposium on '*Working with Women in Goa: Avenues and Challenges*' which aimed at:

1. Networking with various professionals and stakeholders working for women's rights and welfare in Goa.
2. Understanding women centric issues in the state.
3. Identifying avenues for research and intervention for SRCW-Goa.

The inaugural event was presided over by the Vice Chancellor of Goa University, Prof. Varun Sahni, Director, Department of Women & Child Development, Govt. of Goa, Shri Dipak Desai, Registrar, Goa University Prof. Y. V. Reddy, Head, Department of Women's Studies Prof. Shaila Desouza, and was attended by various academicians from around Goa, faculty of various University Departments, students and NGOs such as Bailancho Saad, Asha Sadan, Lifeline Foundation, Nirmala Institute of Education, Positive People, Kiran Niketan, Anyay Rahit ZIndagi (ARZ), Jamaat E Islami Hind - Goa, and Saad Angan.

Prof. Shaila Desouza, Head, Department of Women's Studies spoke on the aims and objectives of Mahila Shakti Kendra and SRCW-Goa and the Director, Department of Women & Child Development highlighted the Department's and Ministry's many schemes for women and the various amendments introduced to efficiently deliver services to the beneficiaries. Some of the schemes that were highlighted were: Mamta, Griha Adhar and 181 helpline which was newly launched in Goa in a Public-Private Partnership. The Vice Chancellor, Goa University, Prof. Varun Sahni stressed on the importance of a feminist perspectives in the implementation of schemes meant for the women of Goa and also on the importance of schemes such as MSK.

The Symposium on 'Working with Women in Goa: Avenues and Challenges' included the following panelists: Mr. Devidas Gaonkar, Adv. Albertina Almeida, Adv. Vijayashree Morajkar, Ms. Diana Dias and Dr. Ida Mukherjee moderated by Ms. Asawari Nayak, State Project Coordinator, SRCW-Goa. Devidas Gaonkar, journalist and activist, brought to the fore issues faced by rural and tribal women in the state. While Albertina Almeida, lawyer and human rights activist, discussed the importance of accountability and transparency in provision of welfare for women; Dr Ida Mukherjee highlighted the importance of focusing on mental health aspects. Diana Dias and Adv. Vijayashree Moraskar reported the situation of sexual minorities and sex trafficked victims in the state and suggested appropriate interventions.

The program facilitated the formation of networks with organizations striving for women's empowerment. The event also helped enhanced understanding of the different women's issues that need prioritizing within the state such as: sex trafficking, issues of rural/marginalized women, issues of sexual minorities such as trans-gender women, mental health needs of women, etc. and identified areas for SRCW's work in initiating convergence initiatives, awareness creation, research and documentation.

2. Capacity Building Workshops: Focused on relationship wellbeing, rights, law enforcement for gender-based violence

Almost immediately after being sworn in as Governor of Goa, in 2014, Dr.Mridula Sinha undertook a study of Goa's unique civil law, the Family Laws of Goa. Round-table discussion sessions were held at the Raj Bhavan with various stakeholders including law professionals, academicians, heads of diverse religious faiths, women's groups and representatives of civil society organizations. The outcome of these discussions was the identification of the need for relationship wellbeing and other capacity building workshops that would reach out to all parts of Goa. The State Resource Centre for Women that had been set up in the Department of Women's Studies was chosen by the Governor of Goa as the agency that would take this project forward. Irrespective of

religion, caste, sexual orientation, socio-economic status or educational status, the SRCW offers all its young adults a programme for gender sensitization, rights awareness and family life education.

Following the inauguration of the first workshop on the 30th November 2018 by Hon. Governor and Chancellor of Goa University, Dr. Smt. Mridula Sinha along with the Hon. Minister- Department of Women and Child Development- Shri. Vishwajit Rane, a series of 6 workshops was conducted on a pilot basis. The SRCW also aimed at the development of workshop curriculum on three themes; a) Legal guidance (to understand rights, acts, legislation) b) Advice on sexual and reproductive health, and c) Interpersonal skills (including gender sensitization mutual respect, non-violent communication, conflict resolution and coping with stress)

a] Focus Group Discussions with the Resource Persons for organizing Relationship Well Being Workshops

Two focus group discussions with the above resource persons were held on the 23 November 2018 and 15 February 2019, which discussed the aims, feedback and way forward of workshops, possibilities were discussed to digitalise the workshops, include more resource persons; it was also discussed that a curriculum could be developed to standardise the workshops along the three themes and in the future SRCW could take on a more training role to pass on the task to conduct the actual workshops on individuals/ organisations working on mental health issues in Goa. It was also discussed that workshops on Legal Advice and Sexual and Reproductive Health with a focus on gender sensitisation could be run on a more regular basis as a lag in awareness about these topics was sensed among the youth.

b] Six Relationship Well-Being Workshops

The Inaugural Workshop held on 30 November 2018 consisted of a series of lectures focussing on topics related to building meaningful and adaptive relationships and included sessions on coping with stress, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, legal advice, rights and entitlements, non-violent communications, inculcation of mutual respect, self-development and advice on sexual and reproductive health, among other related topics.

The First Workshop was conducted on 30 November 2018 and saw the presence of all six resource persons who discussed on various topics related to the Relationship Well Being Workshop such as Sexual Reproductive Health, Mental Well Being, Better Communication in Relationships, Legal Aid and personality in a Relationship.

The Second Workshop was conducted on 21 December 2018 and involved an interactive session with a Counsellor and yoga expert Ms Vaishnavi Hegde on: 'Focusing on the Self in a Relationship'. Stress-management, self-care gender dynamics of a relationship, and advises on how to cope with abusive or toxic relationships were some of the topics discussed.

The Third Workshop was conducted by Counsellor Ms. Prachi Khandeparkar at DMC College, Assagao on 16 January 2019 and focussed on 'Building Healthy Relationships' and covered a wide range of topics from the meaning and types of relationships, to discussing media portrayals and coping and adaptive mechanisms.

The Fourth Workshop on 'Legal Rights in a Relationship' was conducted by Adv. Caroline Collasso on the 18 January, 2019 which educated the audience on laws related to marriage, divorce, succession, custody, dowry, domestic violence, sexual harassment, among others.

c] Training for 181 Women's Helpline Counsellors

A training programme for 181 Women's Helpline Counsellors was organised on the 25 February, 2019. As the 181 Helpline Scheme of the Department of Women and Child Development is operated by GVK EMRI Company at Bambolim, the training took place in the conference hall of their facility.



The programme included the following multidisciplinary expert resource persons on the panel:

- Dr. Meeran Chadha Borwankar: retired IPS Officer (Maharashtra cadre), author, public speaker, trainer and recipient of President of India Police Medal for Distinguished Services 2006 and Police Medal for Meritorious Services 1997
- Advocate Caroline Collasso: Lawyer and Goa State Representative of the Human Rights Law Network
- Dr. Nishtha Desai: Assistant Professor at Dept. of Women's Studies, Goa University

The training was interactive in nature and employed participatory methodology wherein various aspects related to providing assistance to Women in Distress (WID) such as collecting relevant information, emergency rescue and laws and legislations related to women were discussed. It was stressed that knowledge of legal/ criminal-justice system was as important as timely psychotherapeutic interventions. It

was also emphasized that awareness raising among women as well as other citizens about schemes, laws and rights was important to enable access, especially to women from marginalized sections.

The feedback from the participants suggested that this training programme was beneficial and much needed; feedback from the resource persons also suggested that SRCW-Goa could assist in the effective implementation of the 181 scheme by:

- Compiling a concise directory of welfare providers for women (such as shelter homes, NGOs, Governmental Organizations), initiating convergence initiatives and defining the scope of the 181 Helpline scheme
- Providing regular and in-depth training for the 181 Helpline Counsellors on the legal and Criminal-Justice related topics. Such as: Domestic Violence, POSH and POSCO Act, etc
- Creating awareness about the 181 Helpline Scheme

As a follow-up on this training, on the 28 February, 2019 the SRCW team along with 181 Helpline counsellors conducted an awareness programme on the 181 Helpline Scheme during meeting organised at Maullinguem village, Bicholim Taluka.

d] Gender Sensitization Training Programme for Goa Police Officials

Conducting training and capacity building programmes on issues concerning empowerment of women in the state, gender sensitization, gender mainstreaming and focusing on the training needs of women in the state is a priority for SRCW. As the incidents of violence and crime against women constitute an area of concern, SRCW organised a 'Gender Sensitisation Programme' for the Goa Police Officials on the 27 February, 2019.

The rationale behind this programme was:

- 1.** To instill a wider understanding on the subject of gender related issues concerning crime.
- 2.** To promote equal participation of men and women in the service dealing with women and crime.
- 3.** To mainstream gender issues into these services.
- 4.** To introduce Feminist Criminology as an important perspective.



The Training Programme was conducted by the following well-experienced resource persons who discussed about gender stereotypes, gender advocacy and the different dynamics of gender-related crimes:

1. **Dr. Meeran Chadha Borwankar:** author, public speaker, trainer and retired IPS Officer who was the recipient of President of India Police Medal for Distinguished Services 2006 and Police Medal for Meritorious Services 1997.
2. **Dr. Mamta Kumari:** Assistant Professor at the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University who obtained her Ph.D. in Feminist Criminology from Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriya Hindi Vishwavidhyalaya, Wardha.

The training session of Dr. Borwankar began with sharing results of a research study which she had conducted on 'Gender Friendliness' in the police force. Stating that Maharashtra has around 30% women and Goa 10% women on the police force, she made a revelation that the women are not always satisfied with the treatment from their male counterparts or superiors (this was especially the case with female constables). She recommended that the work shifts must be regularised and that the force should also accommodate the differential needs of female officers: such as being sensitive to them during pregnancies, provision of crèche and other schemes and infrastructure (toilets and restrooms). She also spoke of the personal hurdles faced by her while in the force and gave an inspiring account of how she overcame them. In the next half of her session, Dr. Borwankar spoke of the importance of being sensitive to

women in distress visiting/ calling police stations. Through discussing real case studies that she had supervised during her time in the force, she quizzed the participants about some gender related aspects of the cases and spoke of best practices of dealing with women-centric cases. The session ended with Dr. Mamta Kumari, Assistant Professor at the Department of Women's Studies speaking on "Decoding Public Perceptions of Police" wherein ways to bridge the gaps between civilians and police and the need for awareness generation was discussed. She presented the different opinions of people from all walks of life through videos and emphasized the relationship of trust between the Police Force and common citizens. Later the participants added different solutions and action oriented steps that can be taken.

SRCW-Goa received a very positive feedback from the police officials that attended the programme and it was suggested that there was indeed a great need for such training programmes to take place on a regular basis for officers in all ranks. It was also confidentially suggested by some female constables that SRCW-Goa could also conduct a research study to assess 'Gender Friendliness' and 'Gender Sensitization' in the Goan Police Force.

3. Motivating Students - "Agents of Change"

The MSK scheme envisages the encouragement of the involvement of student volunteers as being vital for enhancing community service and gender equality. The State Resource Centre for Women-Goa being located within the Department of Women's Studies of Goa University is best placed to coordinate student volunteers as we have access to a large network of students at the college level and other affiliated institutions as well as within the Goa University Campus. Some of the work done with students is detailed below.

a] Purple Campaigns for Gender Equality

The Purple Campaign is a regular event of the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University wherein issues related to gender equality are introduced to undergraduate students of different colleges of Goa using games, quizzes and interactive lectures. Over the past four years the Department has organized many purple campaigns in collaboration with colleges in Goa. The students are introduced to various topics such as gender discrimination, stereotyping and other issues faced by women. The SRCW Staff has also been involved in the conduct of purple campaigns since September 2018.

b] Awareness Generation Programme: 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao'

SRCW-Goa commemorated International day of the Girl Child Day on the 11 October 2018 by organizing an awareness campaign on 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao' through the medium of street plays. This venture was supported and executed by student volunteers from Goa University who performed in three locations of Panaji City namely: Miramar, Panaji Bus Stand and the Panaji Market attracting the attention of crowd to BBBP themes such as female infanticide, discrimination of girl children in educational and health, gendered aspects of violence, among other topics.

The UN recommends observing this day to enhance awareness on gender inequality faced by girls across the globe and to facilitate creation of opportunity for girls. This celebration also propagated the importance of involving girls and young women in considerations of development policy, programming, campaigning and research. Since we recognize the importance of youth involvement as agents of change to enable gender parity, we further wish to carry out such activities involving students in the future.

To spearhead this campaign further, SRCW also started a social media campaign wherein people from the posed with placards with messages along BBBP themes and posted the photos on social media for benefit of tech-savvy crowd.

c] Film Festival: Looking Through Women's Eyes

A Film Festival of movies by women was organised on 13 and 14 December 2018 at Goa University to commemorate the completion of 30 years of Women's Studies as an academic discipline in Goa University. The rationale behind this event was to initiate a discussion on the importance of women's perspectives in media, particularly in films.

d] 'Making Equality a Reality': Intercollegiate Student Festival (MEAR 2019)

SRCW-Goa believes in engagement and involvement of students to further the cause of enabling gender parity. It is an annual feature of the Department of Women's Studies to commemorate International Women's Day with an Intercollegiate Festival of Competitions. SRCW-Goa participated in the organising of the same on the 8 March, 2019. This student event helps in a) build confidence and leadership skills amongst students b) promoting student engagement in the academic field of Women's Studies c) creating youth change-agents to enable gender equality. The theme of MEAR 2019 was "*Technovation for Gender Equation*", inspired by the United Nations' theme for International Women's Day 2019. This year 13 collages participated.

e] Motivating "Gender Champions" on UGC Programme

The State Project Coordinator of SRCW-Goa was invited to inspire students on the steps that they can take to bring upon gender parity through taking simple and creative steps at the second phase of the gender sensitisation workshop for Gender Champions under the UGC programme organised by the College Development Council and Department of Women's Studies- Goa University on the 2 March 2019. Gender Champions is recommended by the UGC and Ministry of Human Resource Development and Women and Child Development. The focus of this year's Gender Champions Programme was to facilitate in students an understanding of social construction of gender and to facilitate discussion on themes related to Sexual Harassment and Ragging.

4. Social Empowerment and Education

a] Interaction by retd. IPS Officer Dr. Meeran Chadha Borwankar with female students of Goa University

On 26 February 2019, SRCW Goa organised a student interaction with Dr. Meeran Chadha Borwankar: author, trainer, public speaker and retd. IPS Officer who spoke to the students (especially female) on the possibilities of joining civil services. She also gave an inspiring account of her own life and stated that with confidence, hard work and perseverance one can achieve anything. The event took place at the Department of Women's Studies, lecture hall at Goa University and a total of 56 students and staff participated.

5. Understanding concerns of Rural Women

a] Field Trip to Vavurla Village, Canacona Goa

SRCW- Goa hopes to focus on rural and marginalised women and thus accompanied the faculty and students of the Department of Women's Studies of Goa University on a field trip to Vavurla Village on the 21 and 22 September, 2018. The village was predominantly inhabited by Velip/Gaonkar communities, which are the Adivasi communities of Goa. Devidas Gaonkar, a community activist and journalist assisted in this field trip and organized discussions with the students on issues faced by the community. The students and staff were also asked to form groups and visit village households to get a more in-depth understanding which was then presented in the form of class presentations. The following issues arose from the presentations:

- 1) Remoteness of the village and challenges to do with access: due to the topographic profile of the village (area being hilly) and lack of infrastructure (no pakka road) the access of villagers to health and other facilities was hampered.
- 2) Lack of proper sanitary facilities: the houses did not have toilets and also had socio-cultural beliefs against building them (eg:toilets being attached to home is polluting)
- 3) Low literacy level among villagers: which hampered (a) access to well-paying job opportunities (b) the parent's abilities to facilitate children's education (c) awareness about rights, schemes and legislations.
- 4) Beliefs related to menstruation and purity and pollution: it was observed that there was exclusion practiced when it came to menstruating women. Menstruation was a tabooed topic and low awareness existed on issues to do with hygiene and choice of menstruation products.
- 5) Caste based exclusion: high caste endogamy was practiced and couples which defied it were excommunicated from the village. Dalits (*Mhars/Chamars*) were not allowed to cross the thresholds of the houses.
- 6) The community members complained that Government officials had used them as labour for constructing the road and for installing the electricity poles and that this labour was unpaid. Some also remarked that the progress of the village is stagnant because of apathy from the larger society towards the community.

This trip facilitated our understanding of villages; especially of issues faced by Adivasi people. For many of the students, it was a first

experience to visit a remote part of Goa. There was also a common consensus that intersectional concerns are important to consider while thinking about welfare of marginalised women; as gender as a power structure did not operate in vacuum, and often interacted with others like class and caste.

6. Research Study on 'Social Mapping of Women in North Goa'

One of the expert-suggestions that arose from SRCW symposium on 'Working with Women in Goa: Avenues and Challenges' held on 8 October, 2018 was that SRCW should engage in data collection and documentation on the status and position of Women in Goa and their role in the society. In order to put this suggestion into practice, SRCW – Goa has decided to launch a state-wide investigation on the topic – '**Social Mapping of Women in Goa**'. This study combines in-depth qualitative (case-study) approach with a quantitative one (collection of demographic data) and will take place in both the districts.

a] Inter-Sectoral Consultation Meeting

An Inter-Sectoral Consultation Meeting was organised on 11 January 2019 wherein grass-root level welfare providers such as Block Development Officers, Gram Sevaks, Anganwadi Workers from five regions of all the talukas of North Goa were invited to share their knowledge of the status and challenges faced by women in their areas. Secretary, Education- Government of Goa, Smt. Nila Mohanan was the chief guest of the meeting and the Department of Women and Child Development and the Directorate of Panchayats, Govt. of Goa assisted in mobilizing the participants. Apart from this, panel discussions were organized along three themes: (1) Discussion on

'Women and Crime' chaired by Police Inspector, Women's Police Station- Panjim, Smt. The launch of the Inter-Sectoral Consultation Meeting signified the launch of SRCW's state-wide research study on the 'Social Mapping of Women in Goa'. Field visits to five randomly selected areas spread across all Talukas of North Goa were organised. The field visits used qualitative research methodologies such as focus group meetings, in-depth semi-structured interviews and participatory tools to enable enquiry into various aspects related to position and role of women in Goa such as:

- Women's health,
- Education,
- Women's participation in politics
- Women in tourism
- Employment
- Violence against women and safety
- Awareness of schemes
- Impacts of migration on women

b] Research Visits

The SRCW conducted research in the following areas which was selected on the basis of the different social circles, issues and different governance systems. The following are:-

- Chimbél, Tiswadi Taluka
- Calangute, Bardez Taluka

- Morjim, Pernem Taluka
- Maulinguem, Bicholim Taluka
- Dhangarwaddo – Bhuipal, Sattari Taluka

The above areas were visited in the month of February 2019. Certain region specific variables were also enquired into such as impact of tourism on women in Calangute and Morjim coastal areas and tourism exposed regions of Goa, socio-economically vulnerable migrant women in Chimbél and Dhangarwaddo.

The participatory tool was made by SRCW and named it as 'Spin the Wheel'. Tool was designed as the music played at the background and the participants were asked to pass on the ball. When music stops the person having the ball had to get up and spin the wheel – the board had different colours. Participants had to pick up a chit of same colour on which a number was written. Each colour was based on the broad topics mentioned above and given numbers. The question was then dictated to the person in their mother tongue and then opened to all.

This ongoing research report will elucidate on the different issues existing and the possible outreach levels that can be carried ahead. This research study will also help in understanding the implementation of different schemes and will also lead to understand its effectiveness.

Part II: Report on Events Attended

1. Launch of 181 Helpline

Department of Health and Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Goa , Panaji, Goa in association with GVK EMRI, officially launched the 181 women’s emergency helpline number on the 10th of September 2018 to help rescue women in distress. SRCW staff was invited to witness the event.

The three-digit helpline number was launched in the year 2013 after the Nirbhaya incident by Union Ministry for Women and Child development. All the States were directed to launch the helpline in the respective states. The 181 toll – free number is a 24x7 helpline which is easily accessible through a landline or mobile service that provides support to women in distress anytime, anywhere.

Shri Vishwajit Rane, the Minister of Department of Health and Department of Women & Child Development, Government of Goa announced the official launch of 181 Helpline Number. An address was also given by Professor Shaila Desouza, Head of Department of Women’s Studies, Goa University followed by the Director of Department of Women and Child, Shri Dipak Desai.

2. Roundtable on 'Women in Power and Decision Making: Importance, Impact and Challenges of Strengthening Women's Participation'

A Roundtable Conference on 'Women in Power and Decision Making' was organised by Evescape, a Goa-based women-centric publication at Margao on the 20 October, 2018. It was attended by 50 women leaders from all over India, coming from several streams: media, politics, STEM fields, lawyers, social workers, academics, NGO personnel and Governmental Organizations, among others. The aim of the conference was to provide a forum to women to strengthen their voices as leaders in governmental and decision making bodies.

Faculty of the Department of Women's Studies, the State Project Coordinator and Specialist Training were part of the roundtable discussion on topics such as:

- 'Role of Political Stakeholders' : to elaborate on how political parties can increase women's participation in political life as party leaders, decision makers and candidates; role of party leaders in facilitating or hindering women's political advancement; making internal party policies and procedures transparent, fair and equitable.
- 'Role of Civil Society': to discuss how civil society organizations, women's groups, media persons and academics can help exercise pressure on stakeholders to initiate external and internal reform in support of gender equality and women's advancement.
- 'Legal Regulations and Measures': to discuss the role of gender quotas to support women's political participation.

3. Paper Presented on 'Navigating privileges as a Male Feminist - Standing in Solidarity with Feminist Movement' at Pune University

The Specialist Training, SRCW was invited to present a paper on '*Navigating privileges as a Male Feminist - Standing in Solidarity with Feminist Movement*' at a National Seminar on 'The Movement of 'our' Times: New Frameworks for studying Women's Movements' organised by the Department of Women's Studies, Pune University on 14 & 15 November 2018. The paper dealt with how men are equally important in making a Gender Just Society and how the Women's Movement in India need to accommodate them.

4. Lecture on 'Gender and Development' at BITS Pilani, K K Birla Goa Campus

The State Project Coordinator of SRCW was invited to deliver a lecture on 'Gender and Development' at Birla Institute of Technology and Science, Goa Campus on the 17 November, 2018 as part a course in Development Studies for undergraduate students. Themes covered were WID, WAD, GAD approaches, Gender and State, Gender and Media, Gender Auditing and Mainstreaming. The students were also made aware of the Mahila Shakti Kendra Scheme of the Government, especially the work of State Resource Centre of Women in research and documentation, training and capacity building and policy analysis and its links to gender and development.

5. Roundtable on '#MeToo: What #WeToo Think about What Ails the Prevention and Redressal System of Sexual Harassment'

Faculty of the Department of Women's Studies and the State Project Coordinator of SRCW-Goa were invited to be part of a roundtable on Sexual Harassment at the Workplace organised by Saad Aangan, a women's rights organization based in Goa in collaboration with International Centre Goa, on 25 November, 2018. Diverse individuals ranging from survivors of sexual harassment, supporters of survivors, ICC/LCC members, lawyers, representation of women's groups, social justice and women's rights groups, among others were invited for this event.

There was some consensus that the recent #MeToo movement has to provoke an introspection on the 'due processes': on the transparency, accountability, and power-structures involved. The speakers also highlighted the importance of shifting the onus of combating sexual harassment from the victim /complainant to the organization and state. It was stressed that the state and the employers should engage in the 'prevention' aspect of sexual harassment along with the 'redressal' and that ensuring the rights of women should be a high priority within the state. The roundtable was a good starting point of the discussion on what are the loopholes in the Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act.

6. Discussant at Samabhav Film Festival 2018 at Don Bosco College, Panaji.

Faculty of the Department of Women's Studies, the State Project Coordinator and Specialist Training were invited as Film Discussants for the Samabhav 2 Day Film Festival on 8 and 9 January 2019 organised by Men Against Violence & Abuse (MAVA) in collaboration with Don Bosco College, Panjim. The film festival discussed different tenets and issues of Gender, Masculinity and Relationships.

7. Judge for 'Socio-Fiesta' at Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science Margao Goa

The Specialist Gender of the State Resource Centre for Women, Department of Women's Studies, Goa University, was called in as a special invitee and a judge at the "Socio-Fiesta" intercollegiate event at Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, Margao, Goa, held on 19 January 2019. The theme of this year's event was 'Embracing the other, progressing together'. This year's Socio-fiesta aimed at pausing and reflecting upon the 'other' and creating strategies to embrace them thereby contributing to the overall progress of ourselves vis-à-vis humanity.

8. Resource Person on 'Gender & Communication Skills' at Govt. High School, Vaddemnagar

The Specialist Training, SRCW-Goa was invited as a Resource Person to talk on the topic 'Gender & Communication Skills' at Govt. High School, Vaddemnagar on 9 February 2019. He illustrated on the meanings of Gender & Sex and how our language has become an epitome of sexism and misogyny.

9. Judge for UGC Gender Champions Programme organised by College Development Council, Dempo College and Department of Women's Studies, Goa University

The Specialist Gender and Specialist Training were invited to be a part of the core evaluation committee, as judges for the Gender Champions Annual Activities Report of the UGC Gender Champions Programme coordinated by the College Development Council, Dempo College and the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University on February 18, 2019.

10. Quiz for Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of Sexual Harassment- Goa University Awareness Programme on 'Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace'

The SRCW-Goa conducted a quiz on the Sexual harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act on the 19 February, 2019 at a workshop organised by the ICC of Goa University. The quiz fostered awareness of the legal and practical aspects of this act among students and faculty of Goa University.

11. Resource Person on 'Career & Academic Guidance' at Govt. High School, Zuarinagar.

The Specialist Training, SRCW-Goa was invited as a Resource Person to talk on the topic 'Career & Academic Guidance' for Std. 10th students of Govt. High School, Zuarinagar on 13 February 2019. He spoke on the different opportunities after doing 10th and also focused on new courses that teach new skills.

12. Paper on 'Modern Thinking and Women's Struggle' at Seminar organised by Department of Konkani, Goa University

As the participants of the programme were teachers from Indian States such as Karnataka, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, the lecture highlighted the importance of gender sensitisation and introduced concepts like gender stereotypes, gender socialization and the relationship gender, literacy and development.

TO EMPOWER WOMEN: State Resource Centre for Women to be launched tomorrow

Panaji: Aiming at enabling holistic empowerment of women in Goa, with special focus on women from marginalised sections, the State Resource Centre for Women (SRCW), Goa will be launched on Monday.

SRCW-Goa has been given the responsibility of providing systematic support to the State government to enable effective implementation of women-centric programmes, schemes and laws, by enabling coordination between experts, organisations and stakeholders working within the state.

The centre is established under the Mahila Shakti Kendra scheme of the Central Ministry of Women and Child Development and the State Directorate of Women and Child Development, while it is being implemented through the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University.

Speaking to Gomantak Times, SRCW-Goa State project coordinator Asawari Nayak said, "The idea is to ensure that welfare is provided across-sectors including health, education, livelihood, etc and its execution is done in a decentralised manner, with continuous involvement and participation from the community. We will conduct research and documentation, consistently review existing policies and legislation for women and design training and capacity building workshops on women-centric issues."

The centre will also provide focused attention to intersectional challenges affecting women, to ensure greater understanding on women's issues and to bring discourses on women belonging to marginalised communities to the forefront.

When asked about how the coordination between experts, organisations and stakeholders will be worked out, she said, "The Centre is supported by DWCD and the Department of Women's Studies, GU. We believe that our location has a unique advantage, as we will work with GU and their networks with subject matter experts, the academic and student community and also the DWCD which is responsible for initiating women-centric schemes at the ground level. We will also continuously engage with NGOs and individuals, working on field and also interact with Goan community at large to understand different aspects related to provision of welfare for women in Goa."

While speaking about the intersectional challenges faced by women, she said, "While providing welfare for women, we need to remember that 'women'

is not a homogenous group. Women from socially devalued castes, minority communities, rural areas, belonging to sexual minorities, impoverished homes may all have different concerns and struggles. Gender as a power structure will intersect with structures of caste, class, and many others and all this will contribute to the social realities of women. Hence we need to keep in mind these intersections while thinking about doing research on women or designing interventions for them. We must be reflective and aware about our social position and also cognisant of theirs and keep in mind that 'one size doesn't fit all' in these cases."

She also opined that it is time to think about contemporary alternatives to meet empowerment needs of women.

"We need to think about providing digital literacy. We are also thinking of involving student volunteers in our programmes. Furthermore, we are planning to provide services that meet the mental health needs of the women. For this, plan to coordinate with the University Counsellor and design programmes like relaxation and self-care training, career and academic guidance for female students, relationship counselling for couples, etc. We also want to conduct gender sensitisation workshops for practitioners engaging with women on a daily basis such as the police, counsellors working for 181 womens helpline, etc."

SRCW launches workshop series at Goa University

The State Research Center for Women (SRCW), on Friday launched its series on 'Relationship Counseling' at the Goa University, its operating center.

The SRCW, launched in September, hopes to run relationship counseling workshops every month, informed Dr Shaila De Souza, head of the Women's Studies Department at GU, who was instrumental in setting up the SRCW.

The SRCW and the Department of Women's Studies puts Goa ahead of other states as we offer students a program for gender sensitization, irre-

spective of religion, caste, and sexual orientation, said Dr De Souza speaking at the launch of the relationship counseling workshop series.

Dr De Souza explained that the seed for the idea to have a SRCW was sown by the Chancellor of the University Dr Mridula Sinha in the year 2014, when the latter called for a roundtable discussion to discuss the problems that affected the people of Goa, and how to resolve them.

The SRCW is funded by the Mahila Shakti Kendra of the Government of India and the Directorate of Women and Child Development (DWCD) of the Government of Goa on a 60:40% funding

basis. Further, Minister for WCD, Vishwajit Rane has extended his full support to the young team at the SRCW and encouraged them to continue

holding these kinds of workshops.

"It is important to involve the younger generation and get them to participate in these dialogues," said Rane at the launch. "The younger generation has a lot to contribute, and these issues are not only for 10 bureaucrats sitting in the government who make policies to discuss," he said.

Aswari Naik, the state co-ordinator at the SRCW, said that the center aimed to develop in people and hold workshops on Interpersonal skills, Advice on sexual and reproductive health, and legal advice.

The Center is also expected to extend systematic support

to the state government, and provide it with information which will help improve state policies for women.

Meanwhile, the Vice-Chancellor (VC) of the University Professor Varun Sahni, while encouraging the young team, congratulated them on starting a project that would have "massive societal ramifications."

"Women hold up half the sky. We need to collectively embed the notion of gender equality," Prof Sahni told the participants of the workshop. "Gender equality is not just a concept, but a fundamentally different approach to life, which needs to be a part of all fields of study," said the VC.


Besides this, the department will also be releasing a magazine called "MEAR" to highlight the department's 30 year journey.
