The objective	This lecture offers future language teachers and language practitioners a decolonial perspective on the scholarship of multilingualism.	
Description of the activity	The lecture was based on how: (1) the Modernity/Coloniality/Decoloniality framework exposes the normativity of one- nation-one-language and one-speaker-one- language as fallacy, (2) the monolingual ideal has inspired a view of multilingualism as the exception, not the rule; as an impediment to proficiency in a single language; and as the co-existence of boundaried and named entities (i.e. languages) alongside each other.	

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Benefit/Key outcome of the event	The talk enabled the participants to engage with multilingualism in different contexts, while also presenting them with an introduction to possible research questions that would encourage them to think critically about language hierarchies and ideologies. Some students who attended the talk mentioned that, for the first time, they felt proud of being multilingual as they began to see the languages they grew up speaking as assets.


