

Rear Admiral Monty Khanna, AVSM, NM (Retd) was commissioned into the Indian Navy on o1 Jan 83. An alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla, he won the 'Best Naval Cadet' award, 'Binoculars', as well as the Midshipman 'Sword of Honor', during his formative years, His afloat commands included Indian Naval Submarine Sindhuvijay and the Frigates Krishna and Gomati. For his tenures at the helm of INSM Sindhuvijay and INS Gomati, the ships were awarded the coveted Unit Citation. In addition to tenures as Naval Assistant to the VCNS and Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Western Naval Command, he

was also the Naval Attaché at the Embassy of India, Washington D.C.

On promotion to Flag Rank, he was appointed as the Assistant Chief of Naval Staff (Foreign Co-operation & Intelligence) from Jan 12 to Dec 13. He was the Commandant of the Naval War College, Goa from Jan 14 to Nov 17 where he conceived and executed the first Goa Maritime Conclave. He thereafter served as Chief Instructor (Navy), Defence Services Staff College, Wellington till his retirement on 31 Aug 2019. He served as the Assistant Military Adviser, National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS), New Delhi from Dec 2019-Dec 2023, during which he officiated as the Military Adviser for over 18 months.

Monty Khanna is a graduate of the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington, College of Naval Warfare, Mumbai and Naval War College, USA. He holds a Bachelor's Degree from Jawaharlal Nehru University, two Master's Degree from Madras University and Cochin University of Science and Technology and an MPhil (Defence and Strategic Studies) from Mumbai University. He is also an alumni of the Near East and South Asia (NESA) center of the National Defence University, Washington DC. He was awarded the Nao Sena Medal in 2000 and the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal in Jan 2017. In 2023, he was conferred the Lifetime Achievement Award by his school, the Lawrence School, Sanawar. He has published over 20 articles in professional journals that include ORF Issue Briefs, Maritime Affairs, and the United States Naval Institute Proceedings. He regularly delivers lectures on a wide variety of subjects that include Leadership, Naval and Military Strategy, Geo-Politics of the Indo-Pacific, Developments within the PLA Navy, Ship Building and Restructuring our Armed Forces. He is an excellent sportsman and has distinguished himself in the sport of yachting. He has represented the country in two Asian Sailing Championships overseas winning a Silver Medal in Hong Kong and Bronze Medal in Hiroshima. He has won several National and Naval awards in the sport.



Prof. Jagannath Panda is the Head of the Stockholm Center for South Asian and Indo-Pacific Affairs (SCSA-IPA). He is also the Editor for ISDP. Besides, he is the Director for Europe-Asia Research Cooperation at the Yokosuka Council on Asia-Pacific Studies (YCAPS); and a Senior Fellow at The Hague Centre for Strategic Studies (HCSS), The Netherlands. Prof. Panda holds a number of adjunct affiliations in various think-tanks and institutions in Asia/Indo-Pacific. He holds a position of International Research Fellow at the Cannon

Institute for Global Studies (CIGS) in Japan; a Senior Research Fellow at the United Services Institution (USI) of India, New Delhi; a Senior Fellow at the East Asian Security Centre at Bond University, Australia; and a Senior Research Fellow at the Japan Forum for Strategic Studies (JFSS), Tokyo. He was a fellow at India's premier think-tank, Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses (now, Manohar Parrikar-IDSA) for one and half-decade [2006-2022]. A senior expert on China, East Asia and the Indo-Pacific affairs, Prof. Panda's research focuses primarily on India's relations with Indo-Pacific powers (China, Japan, Korea, USA); China-India Relations, EU-India Relations; and EU's infrastructure, connectivity and maritime initiatives in Indo-Pacific, Prof. Panda has testified to the US-China Economic and Security Review Commission at the US Congress on 'China and South Asia'. He is Series Editor for Routledge Studies on Think Asia, and Editorial Board Member of the Journal of Asian Public Policy (JAPP: Routledge). Prof. Panda is a keen follower of Chinese, Japanese and Korean affairs including Indo-Pacific power politics, having been a Korea Foundation Fellow (2018) and Japan Foundation Fellow (2018). He has written for The National Interest, China Brief (Jamestown Foundation), The Diplomat, Nikkei Asia, 38 North (Stimson Centre), Asia Times, The Japan Times, The Diplomat, South Asian Voices (Stimson Centre), The Asan Forum, East Asia Forum, PacNet Commentary, Asia-Pacific Bulletin, The Independence (UK), The Strait Times (Singapore), The Hindu, The Indian Express, The Tribune and The Pioneer, besides others. Prof. Panda's authored books include India-China Relations; China's Path to Power: Party, Military and the Politics of State Transition; Quad Plus and Indo-Pacific; Scaling India-Japan Cooperation in Indo-Pacific and Beyond 2025; The Korean Peninsula and Indo-Pacific Power Politics: Status Security at Stake, India-Japan-ASEAN Triangularity, and the Future of Korean Peninsula: Korea 2032 and Beyond. His peer-reviewed articles feature in the Journal of Indo-Pacific Affairs, Journal of Asian Public Policy, Journal of Contemporary China, Journal of Asian and African Studies, Journal of Asian Affairs, Strategic Analysis, China Report, Asian Perspective, Portuguese Journal of International Affairs, Indian Foreign Affairs Journal, etc.



Dr. Anshu Joshi is an Assistant Professor at the Centre for Canadian, US, and Latin American Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. Her areas of specialisation span Global Security Studies, Counterterrorism issues and initiatives, Foreign Policy and Diplomacy, Geopolitical developments in Latin America, etc. Notwithstanding

her eight years of research and teaching experience, Dr. Joshi enjoys past competence and attendant experience, having worked with reputed IT companies. She has conducted training sessions on corporate branding, storyboarding/storytelling and creative research writing. She has worked at the All India Radio, and FM Gold, as a presenter and script writer on pertinent national and international themes. She also harbours experience in curriculum development for the School of Engineering and the School of International Studies, at JNU.



Dr. Swasti Rao is Associate Fellow at the Europe and Eurasia Centre, Manohar Parrikar Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses (MP-IDSA), India's premier think tank under the aegis of Ministry of Defence. Swasti has undertaken significant projects in collaboration with India's Ministry for External Affairs and Ministry of Defence. Her ongoing research project at the MP-IDSA revolves around the theme of "Conflicts in Europe

amidst shifting Power Structures and Europe's Indo-Pacific outreach." An alumnus of JNU, India; Tsukuba University, Japan and IHEDN, France; she is a recipient of Japanese Education Ministry Fellowship (MEXT) in 2011 and the 'Okita Memorial Scholarship' in 2010 from ICCR. Before joining MP-IDSA she was Assistant Professor in the Department of Strategic and Security Studies, AMU, India. She writes a fortnightly column on security issues for The Print. She represented India at the EU Security Dialogue, the Schuman Forum, held at the European Parliament at Brussels in March 2023. She has been lecturing the Indian Border Security Force Commandants and the Indian Revenue Service Officers on European Security Order and Geo-Economics.



Dr. Vaishali Krishna is an Assistant Professor at the Centre for Russian and Central Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi. She is also a Concurrent Faculty in Special Centre for E-Learning (SCEL) at the same University besides being an adjunct faculty in the Department of Political Science at Mizoram University. She holds her B.A. and M.A. in Political Science from

Delhi University, MBA from Symbiosis, Pune and M.Phil & Ph.D. from the School of International Studies, JNU. She had also been an ICSSR Post-Doctoral Fellow (2017-19) affiliated to JNU. Her Research interests lie in Eurasian Studies with a focus on governance, geopolitics, development, foreign policy and security issues of Post-Soviet Central Asia, Mongolia and Russia. She has to her credit a book entitled Mongolia and Russia: Constructive Re-engagements and around 25 research articles and papers published in journals and edited volumes. Chaitanya Giri is an Associate Professor at the Department of Physical and Natural Sciences, FLAME University, Pune where he researches on technostrategy, space economy, and science diplomacy. Prof. Giri's PhD in astrochemistry won him the 2014 Dieter Rampacher Prize, from the Max Planck Society, in Germany. He has worked at the Tokyo Institute of

Technology, Carnegie Institution for Science, and the NASA Goddard Space Flight Center. Chaitanya was a Fellow for Space and Ocean Studies at Gateway House, during 2018-21. Since 2021, he has been a Space Diplomacy Consultant at the Research and Information System for Developing Countries. He consulted the National Security Council Secretariat at the Prime Minister's Office and was on the International Cooperation Review Committee of the Ministry of Science and Technology and the Ministry of Earth Sciences. He sits on the Advisory Board of the Satcom Industry Association-India and is a Member of the NITI Aayog Committee on Space Economy.



Dr. Dhanasree Jayaram is an Assistant Professor,
Department of Geopolitics and International
Relations, and Co-coordinator, Centre for Climate
Studies, Manipal Academy of Higher Education,
Karnataka, India. She is also a Research Fellow, Earth
System Governance; Member, Climate Security Expert
Network; Research Fellow, Centre for Public Policy

Research; Non-resident Fellow, Finnish Institute of International Affairs; and Research Associate, Network for Education and Research on Peace and Sustainability (NERPS). She pursued the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation's International Climate Protection Fellowship at Freie Universität and Centre Marc Bloch, Berlin, Germany in 2022-23; a visiting fellowship (Erasmus Mundus – short-term PhD) at Leiden University, the Netherlands in 2014-15; and the Swiss Government Excellence Scholarship at University of Lausanne, Switzerland in 2018-19. Dr. Jayaram's areas of research include environmental and climate security; climate diplomacy; regional environmental policy in South Asia and the Indo-Pacific; gender and climate governance; geopolitical and security implications of solar geoengineering; and environmental peacebuilding. She is the author of Breaking out of the Green House: Indian Leadership in Times of Environmental Change (2012) and Climate Diplomacy and Emerging Economies: India as a Case Study (2021).



Dr. Alvite Ningthoujam is an Assistant Professor at the Symbiosis School of International Studies (SSIS), Symbiosis International (Deemed University), Pune, Maharashtra. From August 2020 to January 2021, he served as Visiting Faculty at the SSIS. He holds Ph. D., from the Centre for West Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University,

New Delhi for his doctoral thesis on Israel's Arms Exports and the US Factor: Case Studies of China and South Africa, 1967-2000. From July 2017 to July 2019, he served as a Consultant at the Strategic Affairs Wing of the National Security Council Secretariat, Prime Minister's Office, New Delhi, and handled issues pertaining to the West Asia-North Africa (WANA) region, and Iran.
