NACLIN 2023 Inauguration

The 26th National Convention on Knowledge, Library and Information Networking-NACLIN 2023 on the theme "Reinventing and Revitalising Libraries: From Striving to Thriving" was organised by DELNET, New Delhi in collaboration with Goa University, Goa from November 22-24, 2023 at the Goa University, Goa. Nearly 250 delegates from different parts of India including Library experts, Librarians, LIS Professionals, Exhibitors and Product Demonstrators actively participated in the Conference.

The Inaugural function began with an invocation of Saraswati Vandana. It was followed by the lighting of the lamp marking the inauguration of NACLIN 2023 by Prof. Harilal B. Menon, Vice-Chancellor, Goa University, Goa; Shri K. Jayakumar, President, DELNET (former Chief Secretary, Kerala and Joint Secretary, Ministry of Culture, Government of India). leadership and incessant zeal to transform the libraries and empower the LIS professionals which has resulted in institutionalising NACLIN by DELNET. NACLIN 2023 pre-conference publication containing 31 papers and NACLIN souvenir were released by Prof. Harilal B. Menon and Shri K. Javakumar respectively, It was followed by the Inaugural address which was delivered by Prof. Menon. He proudly informed the delegates that NEP 2020 has been fully implemented in Goa University at all levels. He further opined that the library has an immensely significant role to play in academics and research. He further said that the library should be dynamic, not static and facilitate easy access to resources, augmenting the knowledge base of the researchers and scholars. He further expressed that the librarian is a teacher of teachers. Prof. Menon further affirmed that updating the resources is very important and that developing a dynamic ecosystem for resources is needed. He felt that the emerging technologies including Al, Robotics, IoT (Internet of Things) and Drones are the four inventions which have transformed the world of knowledge. He said that Al based algorithms are replacing human workforce and that we have to walk in tandem with the speedily evolving technology. Prof. Menon said that Librarians are the information carriers. He further said that we need to develop libraries for differently abled population and make it inclusive in scope and coverage. He said we have to work towards making the world differently-abled friendly and he wished all a very successful conference which would help in implementing better methods of knowledge dissemination. Dr. Sangeeta Kaul informed the Chief Guest that DELNET is in the process of developing a global information portal for people with special needs. It was followed by the Presidential Address by Shri K. Jayakumar, President, DELNET. He

welcomed everyone to the great assembly of information professionals and said that it is heartening that experts from libraries have put in so much intellectual energy. He said that DELNET plays a pivotal role in offering two major services, i.e. Library Networking and also to act as a catalyst and facilitator for intellectual exchange by organising numerous programmes. conferences, Webinars, etc. Shri K. Jayakumar paid his humble tributes to Dr. H. K. Kaul for his benevolence, his quiet unimposing presence and said that he was prophetic, a great visionary. He mentioned that life is changing at an unprecedented pace, unless one adapts to this tidal force, this ubiquitous change, one will be washed away. He said that change is permanent and everything has changed drastically. He said that resilience and sharing have been the catch words at DELNET. He further said that cooperative competition/collaborative competition should be the way of the world now. As librarians, we need to be aware of how the world is changing in terms of the role of a Librarian which is to work as a Meta-teacher to be globally aware. He

further felt that with the changing times the syllabus of the Departments of Library and Information Sciences need to adapt with the changing requirements. Shri K. Jayakumar said that DELNET will be happy to equip the professionals in coping with this ever-evolving world and will be our support system in staying relevant. 





The panel discussion on the theme of the Conference "Reinventing and Revitalising Libraries: From Striving to Thriving" was organised after the technical sessions. It was moderated by Dr. Sangeeta Kaul. The panelists were Dr. P.R. Goswami; Dr. Sumeer Gul; Dr. Suresh Jange and Dr. Rekha D. Pai. The panel deliberated on a series of important aspects concerning the theme of the Conference. The question put forth by the moderator was how to bring back students to the libraries. Dr. Goswami deliberated on how to build up libraries and reading habits among the rural youth and children.


Dr. Rekha Pai who spoke during the panel discussion mentioned that we are moving from paper society to paper-less society. The same is expected in the case of libraries as well. The electronic resources would enable to reach to the large number of people at any time anywhere which will help reduce the physical infrastructure requirements as were being required earlier. She has also suggested that the libraries should open doors to the public at large. Dr.Suresh Jange, urged the need for going to the readers with an empathetic approach. Dr. Sumeer Gul who spoke during the course of discussion urged the need to reinvent and revisit the present role of information dissemination.

All of them expressed their view that sooner than later the role of libraries would acquire the shape of digital information-dissemination centres. Dr.Goswami opined that the government has to set up libraries in the villages and he highlighted the role of BALA and NITI Aayog in ensuring the presence of libraries or e-libraries within the reach of everyone in the country. He said that librarians should come out of the four walls of the library and reach out to readers. Dr. Suresh Jange urged the need for constituting a consortium comprising the librarians under the auspices of the Higher Education Council of the respective states.
