10. The objectives of the Program/activity/event	To understand the status and background of tribal communities in different parts of India. To study their culture, traditions and customs as reflected in tribal folk literature.

11. Description of the Program/activity/event	The event commenced with a public lecture by Prof. Anvita Abbi, who addressed the audience on the topic " Adivasi Creation Tales: An Inquiry Into our Beginnings" Prof. Anvita Abbi, a renowned linguist and researcher, captivated the audience with her profound insights into Adivasi creation myths and their cultural significance. She emphasised the importance of oral traditions in preserving indigenous knowledge and highlighted the deep-rooted connections between language, folklore, and identity.
	Her discussion covered various tribal creation stories from across India, illustrating how these narratives shape community beliefs, societal structures, and environmental perspectives. She also drew parallels between different tribal traditions, showcasing their similarities and unique attributes. The lecture was highly engaging, with Prof. Abbi with vivid examples and historical references to bring the stories to life.
	The session was attended by 74 participants, including faculty members, research scholars, students from various disciplines and external participants. The interactive Q&A session that followed saw enthusiastic participation, with attendees posing insightful questions about the documentation, preservation, and contemporary relevance of Adivasi myths. Prof. Abbi provided thought-provoking responses, emphasising the role of academia in safeguarding indigenous narratives.
	The session commenced with the compere, Ms. Snigdha Naik, inviting Prof. Joydeep Bhattacharjee, the officiating principal of the Government College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Quepem, delivered the formal welcome address. The lecture was coordinated by Mr. Sushant Naik, and Prof. Mehtab Bukhari, the

	convenor of the Tribal Development Committee (TDC). Dr. Prakash S. Parienkar, Director of VRPP, delivered the opening remarks, expressing gratitude to Prof. Abbi accepted to conduct sessions not just at Government College of Arts, Science and Commerce Quepem, but at six different colleges throughout the week. He spoke about the Visiting Research Professors Programme initiative at Goa University, outlining its objectives and significance in fostering academic excellence and research. He also acknowledged the contributions of the organising committee for their efforts in successfully hosting the event. Following this, Prof. Mehtab Bukhari provided an overview of the various activities conducted under the Tribal Development Committee (TDC) at Government College, Quepem, highlighting their impact and importance. Mr. Sushant Naik delivered the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the resource person and the Director of VRPP, Goa University. He acknowledged contributions of the organisers in making the lecture a resounding success. The event reinforced the importance of preserving indigenous knowledge systems and provided a platform for meaningful academic discussions.

The lecture helped them understand how important this folk literature is to them as they explore the existence of the tribal community through this folk literature. The lecture will also greatly help in the study of tribal folk literature to explore their linguistic traditions and conduct sociolinguistic studies.

Bio Data

Prof. Anvita Abbi

A Ph. D. from Cornell University, N.Y., USA, Anvita Abbi is a rigorous researcher, a highly respected teacher and guide, a successful administrator, and a distinguished academic from Jawaharlal Nehru University where she taught for four decades. Maintaining the noblest traditions of academia, she combines her scholarship with effortless humility and kindness. She is undoubtedly one of the world's most distinguished researchers on minority languages. In the case of the vast Indian subcontinent, she may be the only one who has conducted first-hand field research on all the six families of languages spoken here. She identified a new language family of India, i.e., the Great Andamanese. Her research was corroborated by population genetics. The Government of India recognized her pioneering work in the form of bestowing upon her the Padma Shri in 2013. Her Manual of Linguistic Fieldwork and the Structures of Indian Languages (Lincom Europa, Germany, 2001) is a prominent reference book consulted the world over by linguists working on the languages of South Asia.

She was awarded one of the most prestigious linguistics awards by the Linguistic Society of America USA the Kenneth Hale Award (2015) for her outstanding lifetime contributions to the documentation and description of languages of India, with a particular note of her extraordinary contributions to the documentation of the Great Andamanese language, a moribund language that is a key isolate in understanding the peopling of Asia and Oceania.

It is because of her undeniable stature in the field that she has been invited as a Visiting professor and researcher at prestigious institutes in the USA, Germany, UK, Canada, and Australia. She has immense experience in field linguistics, language documentation, and analysis of ethno-linguistic aspects of language use. Her wide experience of working on tribal languages of Jharkhand, Northeast, and Andaman and Nicobar makes her a truly rare linguist. Her experience of working with minorities and tribals has motivated her to write extensively on language and education policy. She served as the UNESCO expert on language issues. At present, she serves on the Expert Committee of the UNESCO World Atlas of Languages and is an Adjunct Professor at Simon Fraser University, Vancouver, Canada in addition to holding the B. B. Borkar Chair for Comparative Literature in Goa University.


