SCHOOL OF CHEMICAL SCIENCES, Goa University

1. To celebrate National Voters Day and promote democratic electoral participation, Voters Day pledge was administered to the students, teaching and non-teaching staff of School of Chemical Sciences (SCS), Goa University on 24th January 2025. All participants assembled at 12.30 pm in LH-1 classroom of SCS to undertake the pledge. A total of 14 faculty members, 8 non-teaching staff members and 48 students undertook the pledge. 2. GOA COLLEGE OF HOSPITALITY & CULINARY EDUCATION
