8. Description of the Program/activity/event

The Annual General Body Meeting of the Goa University Alumni Association (GUAA) was convened on 21st June 2025 at 3:00 PM in the Conference Hall of Goa University. The meeting brought together members of the academic and alumni community to review the Association's progress, assess its financial performance, and deliberate on strategic initiatives to enhance alumni engagement and support the University's mission.

The meeting commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Arvind Haldankar, who outlined the agenda for the day. This was followed by remarks from the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Harilal B. Menon, who underscored the vital role of alumni in the University's sustained growth and development.

A key highlight of the meeting was the presentation of the audited financial statements for the year 2024–25 by Dr. Harip Kanapuri. The report reflected noteworthy contributions from alumni and reaffirmed GUAA's commitment to student welfare through scholarships and related initiatives.

The meeting also addressed the forthcoming renewal of the Association's registration, an essential step for maintaining legal continuity and fulfilling NAAC accreditation requirements.

Several strategic proposals were discussed to further strengthen alumni engagement,

including:

- Nomination of representatives from affiliated colleges
- Introduction of the designation of "Patron Members"
- Organization of future alumni meets in hybrid mode (physical and virtual)
- Enhanced visibility of alumni activities and office bearers on the University website

In addition, members recommended expanding alumni outreach in schools through mentorship programs, motivational talks, and career guidance sessions, aiming to foster early connections between students and the University.

An administrative resolution was passed to update the signatories of the GUAA bank account in line with the newly elected office bearers.

The meeting concluded with the election of a new Executive Committee for the term 2025–2027, followed by a vote of thanks to the outgoing committee for their dedicated service.


