Goa University Admissions Ranking Test (GU-ART) Round-I and Round-II for admission to various Post Graduation Degree Programmes offered at Goa University and its Affiliated Colleges offering Post Graduation Programmes for the academic year 2025-26 was conducted. Based on the GU-ART Round-I and Round-II, selected candidates have confirmed their seats as per the Ranking for various Programmes. As seats are still available, the University has decided to invite applications and conduct the Round II and Round III of GU-ART, for the respective Programmes.

Applications for admission to the following PG Programmes shall be accepted through the online mode only from **10th July 2025 to 15th July 2025**. Interested candidates are informed to visit Goa University website: www.unigoa.ac.in for details.

Candidates who have already answered previous GU-ART 2025-26 Round for a particular Programme, are not required to apply again.

A. GU-ART Coverage:

Admission to the Post Graduate Programmes shall be based on GU-ART. For list of Programmes offered at the University Schools and Affiliated Colleges, refer [Annexure I](#) & [Annexure II](#) respectively.

B. Eligibility:

Admissions to the Post Graduate Programmes shall be entirely based on the **Goa University – Admissions Ranking Test (GU-ART)**. The marks/percentage obtained by the candidate while graduating would only be used to ascertain the eligibility of candidates for the Programme. The purpose of the GU-ART is only to rank the prospective candidates and not for determination of pass/fail.

Candidates who are in their Final Year of Graduation for Other University are also eligible to apply.

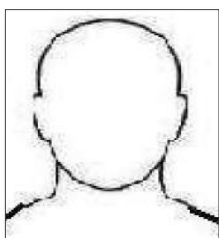
Selected candidates who are in the Final Year of Graduation for Other University shall be granted Provisional Admission. Their admission shall be confirmed after the results are declared based on the eligibility. In case a candidate fails to clear the Graduation Examination, the admission shall stand cancelled and the fees shall be refunded.

The Change of Discipline Test shall NOT be conducted.

C. Filling up of the Online Application Form:

Admissions Portal Link: <https://unigoaadmission.samarth.edu.in>

- a) The **LAST DATE** for submission of applications is **15th JULY 2025**.
- b) Candidates are advised in their own interest to apply online much before the closing date and not wait till the last date for applying/payment of application fee to avoid the possibility of disconnection/inability/ failure to log on to the website on account of heavy load on the website.
- c) Goa University does not assume any responsibility to candidates in case they are unable to submit their application by the last date on account of the aforesaid reasons or for any other reason beyond the control of the University.
- d) The softcopy of the Passport size photograph and Signature provided by the candidate has to be according to the specification mentioned below:
 - i. Digital Photo and Signature are required in .jpg or .jpeg image format.
 - ii. File size of digital photo must be within 10KB to 500 KB limit.
 - iii. **The face must take up 70-80% of the photo.**

- iv. The same photograph and signature shall be used to issue Admit Cards for GU-ART, for issuance of University ID card and Examination Registration Process.
- v. Candidates shall not upload Selfies or photos of passport size photograph.
- vi. Student should mandatorily have the following documents in specified format to complete the online application. (Note: The documents to be uploaded should be in pdf
/ JPEG / JPG / format with file size 10KB-500KB)
 - SSC Marksheet, HSSC Marksheet, UG Marksheet, PG Marksheet. (PDF format)
 - Income Certificate, Sports Certificate, Cultural Activity Quota Certificate (PDF/JPEG/JPG)
 - Recent Passport Size Colored Photograph (JPEG / JPG)
 - Reservation category certificate - SC/ST/OBC(NCL)/EWS/PwD. (PDF format)
 - Declaration of Only Girl Child. (PDF/JPEG/JPG) on plain A4 size paper only.

e) Printout of the application form is NOT REQUIRED to be submitted to the University.

Application Fees (Non-refundable) (To be paid online through Samarth portal only):

- INR 750 in case candidates belonging to Un-reserved/ EWS/OBC(NCL) for first application per subject/specialization, and INR 600 in case of every subsequent application in subject/specialization.
- INR 375 in case of Candidates belonging to SC/ST category from Goa per subject/specialization, and INR 300 in case of every subsequent application in subject/specialization.
- No fees shall be charged from Persons with Disability.

*Candidates applying for admission under these categories shall be required to submit a valid Certificate to that effect issued by the Officer of the rank of the Deputy Collector or any other authorized Officer as notified by the Government of Goa.

D. GU-ART: Candidates are requested to note the following details regarding the GU-ART.

- 1. Candidates shall be permitted to apply for a maximum of five subjects/specializations for the PG Programmes.**
- 2. Candidates who wish to apply for more than one Programme for Round II and Round III are required to use the same login details.**
3. No changes shall be entertained after the application is submitted online.
4. The GU-ART shall be of One Paper of 100 marks, containing 50 objective Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQ) of 2 marks each. There shall be negative marking, where half a mark shall be deducted for each wrong answer. No marks shall be deducted for unanswered questions. The duration of the GU-ART shall be 90 minutes.
5. The breakup of 100 marks for the GU-ART Question Paper shall be as follows

a.	Section I (Least difficult)	- 15 Questions
b.	Section II (Difficult)	- 15 Questions
c.	Section III (Most difficult)	- 20 Questions
6. In case candidates who have answered the GU-ART and have secured equal marks in the ranking list:
 - a. Section III scores shall be the first level of tie breaker, followed by Section II
 - b. In case the tie still exists, the University shall decide the order of merit.

- F. A Common GU-ART shall be conducted for admission to MA Wellness Counselling and Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance Counselling
- G. Candidates answering the GU-ART Round II shall be ranked after the candidates who has answered previous Round. Example: If 100 candidates apply for Round I, all 100 shall be assigned a rank based on the marks scored. For Round II, candidates shall be ranked from 101 onwards. The candidate scoring highest marks at GU-ART Round II shall be ranked 101.

H. Anti- Ragging:

In order to curb the bad practices such as ragging on the University campus and in its affiliated colleges, the University authorities are committed to strictly take serious actions on the matter as supported by the law and follow UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (<http://www.ugc.ac.in/page/ragging-related-circulars.aspx>) as Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2008 and the amendments carried out thereafter.

GU-ART Schedule:

The GU-ART Round II and Round III for the respective Programmes shall be held on **18th July 2025**.

The Test shall be held in ONLINE MODE. Login Credentials shall be shared with the Candidates on 17th July 2025.

Admission Process:

1. The results of **GU-ART Round II and Round III** of the respective Programmes shall be displayed on the University Website tentatively by **22nd July 2025**.
2. Candidates answering the Round II GU-ART Rounds shall be ranked after the Round I and the candidates answering the Round III GU-ART Rounds shall be ranked after the Round II candidates.
3. Process of allotment of seats shall be notified on the Goa University Website.

REFUND OF COURSE FEES

- a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the Programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five tier system shall be followed for their fund of fees remitted by her/him.

Sr. No.	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is served to the Institution	% of refund of Aggregate fees*
1.	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission. #	100%
2.	Less than 15 days before the formally notified last date of admission.	90%
3.	15 days or less after the formally notified last date of admission.	80%
4.	30 days or less, but more than 15 days after the formally notified last date of admission.	50%
5.	More than 30 days after the formally notified last date of admission.	0%

*Inclusive of tuition fees and non-tuition fees but exclusive of Caution Deposit

#Last date of admission shall be notified later on the university website.

- b) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the aggregate fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/- shall be deducted as processing charges from their fundable amount.
- c) All other cases of refund of fees will be decided on a case-to-case basis on its merit.
- d) The Seat Confirmation Fee is fully refundable in case of withdrawal of provisional admission within 30 days from the last date of admission.
- e) Fees shall be fully refundable in case a candidate fails to qualify the UG Examination.

ANNEXURE III

RULES FOR SELECTION

General

1. If a candidate after securing admission to a Programme wishes to transfer her/his seat from a University School/Department to another or from a College Programme to University School/Department and vice versa her/his fee shall be is transferred or refunded as per UGC Rules.
2. All Seats which were allotted at Round I and Round II but were not confirmed by the candidates by payment of Seat Confirmation Fees will be offered to the eligible candidates.
3. Vacant Reserved category seats after 1st Provisional List of Round I and Round II are transferred to Un-Reserved Category only.
4. Post declaration of the qualifying examination results, eligible candidates shall be given time to verify the documents and enroll for the Programme by paying the balance fees.
5. **The Seat Confirmation Fee is fully refundable only in case of candidate's failure to pass the qualifying examination.**

ANNEXURE VI
ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO PG PROGRAMMES

A] Shenoi Goembab School of Languages & Literature:

Master of Arts English, French, Hindi, Konkani, Marathi and Portuguese:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts, a candidate shall have passed the examination of Degree of Bachelor of Arts General/ Honors of the University in the subject for which admission is sought or an examination of any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

B] DD Kosambi School of Social Sciences & Behavioural Studies:

i) Master of Arts in Sociology, Geography and Psychology:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts a candidate shall have passed the examination of Degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) General/ Honors in the subject for which admission is sought of the University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

ii) Master of Social Work:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Social Studies a candidate must have completed graduation in any discipline from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

iii) Master of Arts in Women's Studies:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Women's Studies, a candidate must have completed graduation in any discipline from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

C] Goa of Business School:

i) Master of Arts in Economics :

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Economics, a candidate must have passed the examination of Degree of Bachelor of Arts General/ Honors of the University in the subject for which admission is sought or an examination of any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

ii) Masters of Commerce (M.Com):

To be eligible for admission to the programme leading to the Degree of Master of Commerce (M.Com.), a candidate must have passed the examination for the Degree of B.Com/BBA/BBA(FS), of this University or an examination of any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

iii) Master of Library and Information Science (M.L.I.Sc):

Graduates in any discipline of the University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto shall be eligible to apply for admission. A student exiting the M.L.I.Sc. Programme after successfully completing one year (40 Credits) shall be awarded B.L.I.Sc. Degree. A student who have completed the B.L.I.Sc. shall be offered admission for Semester III of M.L.I.Sc. programme.

iv) Master of Computer Application (MCA):

To be eligible for admission to the two- y e a r MCA Programme, a candidate must have:

a..Passed BCA/ Bachelor Degree in Computer Science/ Engineering or equivalent Degree with at least 50% marks.

OR

b..Passed Graduation in a Non-Computer Science discipline with Mathematics at 10+2 level or at Graduation level with at least 50% marks (5% relaxation in minimum percentage for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non-Creamy Layer)/PwD shall be applicable as per State Government Rules). Such candidates shall be provisionally admitted until successful completion of Bridge Courses.

c.Admission to Semester III (Applicable for Non-Computer Science Graduates): The Non-Computer Science candidates are required to successfully complete the Bridge Course(s) before admission to the third Semester. To be considered successful, the student is required to obtain a minimum of 40% marks separately in the Theory and Laboratory components. The assessment of the Bridge course(s) shall be conducted by the Goa Business School.

Candidates shall have to complete Bridge Courses via self-study. Candidates are preferably advised to undergo the Bridge courses before the start of the programme.

v) M.Sc. Artificial Intelligence and M.Sc. Data Science

To be eligible for admission to the two-year M.Sc. Artificial Intelligence and M.Sc. in Data Science Programmes, a candidate must have:

i. Bachelor Degree in Computer Science/ Computer Applications/ Data Science/ Artificial Intelligence/ Engineering (Computer Science/ Information Technology/ Data Science/ AI) or equivalent Degree with at least 55% marks.

OR

ii. Bachelor Degree in Mathematics/Statistics/Electronics/Physics/Chemistry/Life Science discipline with at least 55% marks and must have opted for Mathematics at XII Science. Such candidates shall be provisionally admitted until successful completion of Bridge Courses.

OR

Any Bachelor Degree in Engineering (except Computer Science/Information Technology/ Data Science/ AI) with at least 55% marks. Such candidates shall be provisionally admitted until successful completion of Bridge Courses.

Candidates shall have to complete Bridge Courses via self-study. Candidates are advised to undergo the Bridge courses before the start of the programme.

iii. 5% relaxation in minimum percentage of qualifying examination for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non-Creamy Layer)/PwD shall be applicable as per State Government Rules.

D] School of Physical and Applied Sciences:

i) Master of Science in Mathematics and Physics:

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Mathematics and Physics, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors in the subject for which admission is sought of the University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

E] School of Biological Sciences & Biotechnology:

i) Master of Science in Botany:

To be eligible for admission to Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Botan, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors in the subject for which admission is sought of the University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

ii) Master of Science in Food Technology:

B.Sc. in Food Technology/ Food Nutrition, and Dietetics/ Microbiology/ Biotechnology/ Zoology/ Chemistry/ Botany/ Life Sciences/ Bio-Sciences or Allied Subjects.

F] School of Chemical Sciences:

i) Master of Science in Chemistry:

- a) To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Chemistry, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science of the University General/ Honors or from any other recognized University, in the subject for which admission is sought.
- b) Candidates applying for admission to the M.Sc. Programme in Chemistry shall be eligible to be admitted to only one of the various specializations at M. Sc., Part II, as notified in the University Prospectus.
- c) Allotment of seats under various specializations of the Master's Programme in Chemistry, shall be specified in the University Prospectus.

ii) Master of Science in Biochemistry:

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Biochemistry, a candidate shall have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors of this University or from any other recognized University. in Chemistry / Biological Sciences (Botany, Zoology/ Microbiology/ Biochemistry/ Biotechnology and allied subject

G] School of Earth, Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences:

(i) Master of Science in Remote Sensing & GIS:

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Remote Sensing & GIS, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors/ B.E. in any branch of the University or from any other University.

(ii) Master of Science in Marine Microbiology:

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Marine Microbiology, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors in Microbiology/ Biotechnology of the University or from any other recognized University.

(iii) Master of Science in Applied Geology:

To be eligible for admission to a Programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Applied Geology, a candidate must have passed the examination of the Degree of Bachelor of Science General/ Honors of the University or from any other recognized University, in the subject for which admission is sought.

H] School of International and Area Studies:

(i) MA International Studies:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in International Studies, a candidate must have completed graduation in any discipline from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

I] Manohar Parrikar School of Law, Governance & Public Policy:

(i) Master of Arts in Public Administration:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Public Administration, a candidate must have completed graduation in any discipline from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

(ii) Master of Laws:

To be eligible for admission to Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Laws, a candidate must have completed graduation in Law from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

J] School of Sanskrit, Philosophy and Indic Studies:

(i) Master of Arts in Philosophy:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Philosophy, a candidate must have passed the examination of Degree of Bachelor of Arts General/ Honors in the subject of Philosophy from this University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.

(ii) Master of Arts in Sanskrit Studies:

To be eligible for admission to the Programmes leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Sanskrit Studies, a candidate must have completed graduation in any discipline from this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto.

ANNEXURE VII

Anti-ragging Guidelines

In order to curb the bad practices such as ragging on the University campus and in its affiliated colleges, the University authorities are committed to strictly take serious actions on the matter as supported by the law and follow UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009

(https://www.ugc.gov.in/Bureaus/bureaus_details?EwV4Rtmy2xJ7nuhP3MYqbpwm5MTBRsa5u2ipRdltuUxMTUu1gSiipessUFP0nrG) as well as Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2008 and the amendments carried out thereafter.

All concerned must know what constitutes 'ragging'. Any or in multiples of the following acts constitutes ragging:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher.

Following functionaries are in place with defined responsibilities:

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

- Ensure the compliance of provisions pertaining to UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging as well as the provision of the Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act 2008 (and amendments)
- Monitor, oversee and guide the anti-ragging squad

ANTI RAGGING SQUAD

- Make surprise raids on hostels, other hot-spots to inspect places of potential ragging on the campus
- Conduct an on-the-spot enquiry into any incident of ragging referred by any person and submit an enquiry report along with recommendations to the Anti-Ragging Committee for action under clause (a) 9.1 of UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 and other relevant Rules/State Acts in force.

MONITORING CELL

Co-ordinate with the affiliated Colleges and institutions to curb the menace of ragging

- Invite reports from the heads of the educational institutions in regard to the activities of the functionaries at their end,
- Conduct orientation programmes, counselling sessions, the incidents of ragging, the problems faced by the wardens or other officials.
- Keep abreast of the decisions of the District level Anti Ragging Committee.
- Review the efforts made by the institutions to publicize anti-ragging measures, soliciting undertakings from parents and students for each academic year to abstain from ragging activities or willingness to be penalized for violations
- Function as the prime mover for initiating action on the part of the appropriate authorities of the Goa University for amending its Statutes or Ordinances or Bye-laws as the case may be and to facilitate the implementation of Anti-Ragging measures at the level of the institutions
- Send the status reports periodically to the state level monitoring cell at the frequencies laid down with the support on logistics and smooth functioning from the [Directorate of Students Welfare](#).

As a part of UGC's initiative towards reduction compliance burden of its stakeholders, UGC has revised the procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit. The revised procedure is as follows:

Step 1: A student will submit his/her details on the same website (www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org) as before; read and confirm that he/she and his/her parents/Guardians have read and understood the AICTE regulations on curbing the menace of ragging. He/She will confirm & agree that he/she will not engage in ragging in any form. (Step is the same like before)

Step 2: The students will receive an e-mail with his/her registration number and a web link. The student will forward the link to the e-mail of the Nodal in his/her University/College. (Please note the student will not receive pdf affidavits and he/she is not required to print & sign it as used to be case earlier)

Step 3: The Nodal Officer in the University/College can click on the link of any forwarded e- mails that he/she will receive from any student of his/her college to get the list of those students who have submitted Anti Ragging Affidavits/Undertaking in his/her college. The list will be updated every 24 hours.

It may be noted that it is compulsory for each student and his/her parent/Guardian to submit an online undertaking each academic year of the two designated websites, namely, www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org.
