Description of the Program/activity/event	The conference brought together leading nephrologists, environmental scientists, occupational health experts, and social researchers to address India's growing chronic kidney disease crisis. The event featured a keynote address by Dr. Narayan Prasad on CKDu, followed by panel discussions with six medical experts along with experts in social affairs and occupational health. Four parallel technical sessions covered socioeconomic aspects, intervention approaches,

environmental factors, and policy frameworks. The conference highlighted alarming CKDu statistics, particularly in vulnerable coastal and agricultural communities, and emphasized the need for interdisciplinary solutions. Student researchers presented groundbreaking studies across multiple disciplines, demonstrating innovative approaches to this complex health challenge.

We also had four technical sessions to facilitate the best presentation competition, and the winners are as follows:

- Technical Session 1 Group 1: Socioeconomic Aspects of Kidney Disease Winner - Dr. Praneta Usgaonkar for her paper titled "Socioeconomic Aspects of Kidney Disease in India"
- 2. Technical Session 2 Group 2: Intervention and Educational Approaches Winner Ms. Maria Dancho for her paper titled "From Soil to Cell: Environmental Pathways in the Pathogenesis of Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD)"
- 3. Technical Session 3 Group 3: Environmental and Occupational Factors Winner Mr. Abhishek Kamat for his paper titled "Hydrogeochemical and Environmental Insights into CKDu Vulnerability: A Case Study from Gaundongrem Village, Canacona-Goa"
- 4. Technical Session 4 Group 4: Policy and Interdisciplinary Approaches Winner Ms. Sakshi Naik Gaonker for her paper titled "When the Kidneys Fail, So Does the System: A Legal Look into Environmental CKD"

12. Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event

Findings: Identification of genetic markers for CKDu Socioeconomic burden on tribal susceptibility, families, Ayurvedic approaches for CKD patients, hydrogeochemical impact on kidneys, ethnobotanical approach for kidney disease treatment. Research Impact: student and researchers' presentations across four technical sessions; integration of traditional Ayurvedic medicine with modern nephrology; comprehensive environmental, and social determinant analysis.

Future Directions: Establishment of research priorities including genetic screening tools, environmental monitoring systems, policy reforms, and community-

In India, the burden is particularly concerning, with approximately 220,000 new End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) patients annually, creating demand for an additional 34 million dialysis sessions each year. While CKD is prevalent across various regions of India, Goa shows a disproportionate burden, especially in coastal areas where residents face heightened risk, suggesting location-specific environmental factors may be contributing to this public health crisis.

This research project, aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 3 (ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being), aims to comprehensively examine CKDu in Goa, India. The study will investigate epidemiology, etiology, risk factors and potential interventions, with particular emphasis on environmental contaminants,

occupational hazards, and socioeconomic determinants affecting disease progression.

By identifying the specific factors driving the high incidence of CKDu in Goa, this research seeks to establish a foundation for targeted public health interventions that address both environmental and socioeconomic pathways to improve renal health outcomes in the region and potentially provide insights applicable to similar contexts globally.
