10. Objectives of the Event	 To educate students and community members on snake behavior, identification, and safety measures. To debunk common myths and misconceptions surrounding snakes. To provide practical first-aid knowledge for snakebite situations. To promote conservation efforts and advocate for peaceful coexistence with wildlife.

Description of the Event	As part of Rural Camp 2025, the workshop "Slither Safe: Workshop on Understanding Snake Safety" was conducted to spread awareness about snake encounters, safety measures, and ecological significance. The session was led by Mr. Tejas Sudhir, a wildlife conservationist and snake rescue expert, who shared practical insights on preventing snakebites, handling emergency situations, and fostering a better understanding of snakes' role in the ecosystem. Key Takeaways from the Workshop:	
	 Understanding Snakes – Identifying venomous vs. non-venomous species, recognizing common behaviors and habitats. Myths vs. Facts – Debunking superstitions and cultural fears associated with snakes. First Aid & Emergency Response – Immediate steps in case of a snakebite, what to avoid, and when to seek medical help. Human-Snake Coexistence – Discussing snakes' ecological importance and how to prevent human-wildlife conflict. The session was highly interactive, with participants engaging in discussions, sharing personal encounters, and seeking expert advice on snake safety. A live 	

	demonstration on safe handling techniques and first- aid procedures added a practical learning experience, ensuring students and community members left with valuable, life-saving knowledge.		
12. Benefit/Key Outcomes of the Event	 Increased awareness about snake behavior and safety protocols. Better preparedness in handling snakebite emergencies and reducing panic responses. Understanding snakes' vital role in the ecosystem, shifting the perspective from fear to conservation.
