Objectives of the Event</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To educate local households on the importance of waste segregation and sustainable disposal practices.</li> <li>• To promote behavioral change towards environmental responsibility and cleaner surroundings.</li> <li>• To encourage active participation in local waste management initiatives.</li> </ul>
<b>11. Description of the Event</b>	<p>The <b>Door-to-Door Awareness Campaign on Waste Segregation</b> at Cotigao Panchayat was an initiative to engage directly with the local community and promote sustainable waste management practices.</p> <p>A total of <b>36 households</b> were visited by students, who conducted <b>informal discussions</b> with residents about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The difference between wet and dry waste and why segregation is crucial.</li> <li>• The impact of improper waste disposal on health and the environment.</li> <li>• Simple, practical steps for effective waste management at home.</li> </ul> <p>To enhance the effectiveness of the campaign, <b>students designed and distributed educational flyers</b>, visually demonstrating <b>proper waste segregation techniques and sustainable waste disposal methods</b>.</p> <p>The response from the community was <b>highly positive</b>, with many residents expressing their willingness to adopt <b>better waste disposal habits</b>. Some even requested <b>more awareness initiatives on environmental sustainability</b>.</p>

Benefit/Key Outcomes of the Event</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Increased Awareness</b> – Educated <b>36 households</b> on waste segregation and sustainability.</li> <li>• <b>Behavioral Change</b> – Encouraged <b>active community participation</b> in responsible waste management.</li> <li>• <b>Sustainable Impact</b> – Strengthened <b>local waste management efforts</b> through awareness and education.</li> </ul>
