10. Objectives of the Event	 To understand the socio-cultural and economic aspects of tribal life. To explore the customs, traditions, and evolution of Goa's indigenous communities. To gain firsthand insights into the challenges faced by tribal groups in contemporary society.

Description of the Event	The workshop on tribal life was an immersive field-based session, where Mr. Devidas Gaonkar guided participants to a tribal hamlet in Cotigao, a central meeting space for the community. During the session, he provided an in-depth understanding of the three major tribal communities in Goa:	
	 Velip – Known for their agriculture, forest-based lifestyle, and cultural heritage. Gawda – The largest tribal group, rich in oral traditions, folk music, and traditional crafts. Kunbi – One of Goa's earliest settlers, recognized for their unique dance forms, traditional attire, and agrarian livelihood. Mr. Gaonkar also spoke about the living conditions of 	
	tribal communities, how they have evolved over the years, and the challenges they face in preserving their identity and cultural heritage. The discussion covered aspects of their social structure, governance systems, and belief systems that continue to shape their way of life. The session was highly interactive, with students	

×	engaging in discussions about tribal rights , government policies , and ways to support indigenous communities through social work interventions.
