Description of the Program/activity/event	The event, chaired by Dr. Shah Faesal, IAS, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Culture, brought together stakeholders from India's creative economy, including artisans, cultural entrepreneurs, policymakers, and academics. Through an interactive brainstorming session, participants identified key barriers such as financial literacy gaps, lack of copyright protection, and bureaucratic challenges. Discussions focused on modernizing traditional practices, integrating digital tools, and fostering collaborations between cultural and business sectors. The event concluded with actionable solutions, including the creation of village-based cultural hubs, stronger government support, and leveraging social media to amplify India's cultural economy on a global scale.	
12. Benefit/Key outcomes of the Program/activity/event	Stakeholders recognized financial literacy gaps, inadequate marketing strategies, lack of copyright protection, and bureaucratic hurdles as	

key challenges. Proposed solutions included digital modernization, storytelling through art, stronger educational programs, and institutional collaborations to boost creative enterprises. Actionable recommendations emphasized creating village-based cultural hubs, strengthening government-backed initiatives, integrating creativity into tourism, and leveraging social media for global outreach. 13. 
