### **Minutes of the Sixth (Special) Meeting of the XI Academic Council**

The Chairperson (Vice-Chancellor) welcomed the members to the Sixth (Special) meeting of the XI Academic Council and informed that since there were three important items needed to be discussed and deliberated upon, this special meeting of the XI Academic Council was being called for.

<b>D 7</b>	<b>OTHER ITEMS</b>
<b>D 7.1</b>	<p><b>To review the Detention Policy applicable for General Education Programmes.</b> The Chairperson (Vice-Chancellor) briefed the House on the Agenda.</p> <p>After detailed deliberations, the Academic Council unanimously resolved the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To permit students of the UG General Education Programmes to be promoted to Semester V irrespective of the number of backlogs in preceding semesters, effective from the Academic Year 2025–2026. This amendment is proposed in alignment with the core principles of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which advocate flexibility in academic progression, a credit-based learning structure, and inclusivity.</li> <li>2. To maintain academic rigour, it was further resolved that promotion to Semester VII shall be permitted only upon successful completion of all courses from Semesters I to VI.</li> <li>3. The matter to be referred to the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) to confirm and accord approval for any additional financial liability that may be incurred by the Government as a result of implementing this amendment, particularly in light of a possible increase in the number of students progressing to the third year of the programme.</li> </ol>

	<p>4. In the event that any such financial implications are identified, prior approval of the Directorate of Higher Education shall be sought for implementation.</p> <p>5. In view of the urgency to communicate the decision for implementation in the Academic Year 2025–2026, the Vice-Chancellor was authorised to approve the amendment on behalf of the Academic Council.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>(Action: Assistant Registrar Academic - Colleges)</b></p>
<b>D 7.2</b>	<p><b>Regarding clarification on change of Ability Enhancement Course as English after First Year of the Programme.</b></p> <p>The Member Secretary (Registrar) highlighted the following:</p> <p>As per the provisions of Ordinance OA-38, which governs the Undergraduate General Education Programmes, students are required to opt for Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) in Semester I and II. The structure mandates the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Semester I &amp; II: AEC shall consist of courses in English Language.</li> <li>• Semester III and IV: Students are expected to achieve competency in a Modern Indian Language (MIL).</li> </ul> <p>Additionally, students classified as Foreign Nationals, Persons of Indian Origin (PIO), Non-Resident Indians (NRI), or those from Foreign Boards are permitted to opt for additional English Language courses or any other Foreign Language course in lieu of MIL.</p> <p>The University has received multiple representations from College Principals, enclosing requests from students who do not fall under the above special categories, seeking permission to continue English Language as their AEC in Semester III and IV, in place of the prescribed MIL courses.</p> <p>The reasons cited include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Academic Difficulty: Students are experiencing challenges in understanding or progressing in MIL subjects.</li> <li>2. Non-availability of Language Offerings: Some students have opted for MIL subjects (e.g., Assamese, Bengali, or other regional languages) that are not offered within the State of Goa.</li> <li>3. Special Needs Cases: Certain students facing intellectual disabilities or documented writing difficulties have requested to continue with English on compassionate and academic grounds.</li> </ol> <p>After detailed discussion, the Academic Council did not accept the requests/representations received from the College Principals seeking permission to continue English Language as their Ability Enhancement Course in Semester III and IV, in place of the prescribed MIL courses.</p> <p>The Chairperson (Vice-Chancellor) informed the house that the Ordinance must be strictly followed/implemented across all the Colleges. No relaxation shall be granted.</p>

	<p>The Board of Studies in MIL Languages were requested to design basic/elementary level Courses which will be offered to the students who do not have any basic knowledge about the respective language.</p> <p>However, in view of the cases of Children with special needs (CwSN), all such cases will be examined and considered on a case-to-case basis.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>(Action: Assistant Registrar Academic - Colleges)</b></p>
<b>D 7.3</b>	<p><b>Proposed part amendment and addendum to SSA-7 and Forms A and H.</b> Prof. Anthony A. A. Viegas, Director, Directorate of Students Welfare and Cultural Affairs (DSW) briefed the House on the proposed part amendment.</p> <p>The Academic Council approved the proposed part amendment to Statute schedule SSA-7 details regarding the functions and procedure for formation of the Goa University Students' Council (GUSC) along with amendment to Nomination form-A and form H with the suggestion to incorporate following changes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The term 'Combined head of passing' from the justification column of clause SSA-7(vi) to be removed.</li> <li>b) Clause SSA-7(xi) Code of Conduct, point d) to be properly specified. 10 days to be modified as '10 working days.'</li> <li>c) Under Form A, note to be indicated as below: 'In case, any information to the above points is Nil. The same is to be indicated as Nil.'</li> </ul> <p>It was decided to place the part amendment to Statute SSA-7 before the Drafting and Vetting Committee and thereafter before the Executive Council for its approval.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>(Action: Director, DSW&amp;CA/Assistant Registrar -Directorates)</b></p>
