Legal Awareness Programme

Department of Women's Studies organized a two days workshop on 'Legal Awareness Programme' at Council Hall, Goa University. Funded by National Commission of Women, Delhi, the workshop aimed to spread legal awareness among Anganwadi teachers. Sixty Anganwadi Teachers attended the workshop from various ICDS (Integrated Child Development Services) blocks.

The dignitaries included Chief Guest Ms. Shilpa Shinde (Secretary, Women and Child Development, Goa), Honorable Guest Advocate Vidhya Arjun Shet Tanavade (Chairperson, State Commission for Women, Goa), and Ms. Anisha Dawar (Delegate, National Commission for Women, Delhi).

Dr. Shaila Desouza, welcomed the dignitaries and thanked them for gracing the event. In her opening speech Chief Guest Ms. Shinde spoke about the importance of the work of Anganwadi teachers in the communities. She also informed participants about the various schemes run by the ministry. Ms. Shinde congratulated the Anganwadi staffs for their exemplary work done in achieving 90% Aadhar enrolment of 0-6 years children.

Advocate Vidhya informed participants about the role of State Commission in the advancement of status of women.
